


Weekly update - 29th January 2021

Post lockdown walking inspiration

We all hope we may be able to get outdoors by Easter. Here are some <u>family friendly walks</u> in the Lake District. If you are walking with someone who may be disabled or less active this is an online guide to Accessible Britain.

Gardens

When you think you know all the gardens to go to and then discover <u>Southlands Garden</u>s in Stretford. Southlands was created by artists Maureen Sawyer and Duncan Watmough, and has been awarded BBC Garden of the Year for the North of England. In 2000 'Southlands' opened its' gates to the public and from 2002, the National Garden Scheme. Since then the garden has gone on to raise thousands of pounds for charity.



During lockdown, you can be transported to some of the most beautiful gardens that open for the National Garden Scheme with their <u>programme of online talks</u> and hear behind the scenes information from the garden owners themselves.

Virtual walks

This is a beautiful <u>virtual walk</u> (55 mins) of Derwent Water. It has amazing nature sounds. If you fancy a virtual climb this is four minute film of a <u>summit climb</u> of Everest. It really conveys the exhaustion. Stunning scenery.

Incredible birds

Learn about the <u>South of Scotland Golden Eagle Project</u> that is helping reinforce the population of one of Scotland's iconic species. Here is a <u>great video</u> showing releases.

The White Tailed Sea Eagle is actually the <u>UK's biggest bird of prey</u>. They actually went extinct in the UK during the early 20th century, due to illegal killing, and the present population is descended from reintroduced birds. They are stunning birds. https://vimeo.com/80365771

Ring necked parakeets are a common feature around south Manchester. But there is a lot of debate on the source of them. <u>Academics are trying to establish</u> if Jimmy Hendrix or George Michael are the source of this cheeky bird.

<u>Andean condors</u> are massive birds, among the largest in the world that are able to fly. Because they are so heavy (up to 33 pounds), even their enormous 10-foot wingspan needs some help to keep them aloft. For that reason, these birds prefer to live in windy areas where they can glide on air currents with little effort. Watch this video of them flying.

Gardening and allotments

If you're not sure growing veg is for you, Kew Gardens <u>has tips on what to grow on your windowsill</u>. Don't fear – there aren't any giant veg about!
