UNESCO World Heritage sites

The UK has <u>32 UNESCO World Heritage Sites</u> including our own <u>Lovell Telescope</u> at Jodrell Bank and the ever popular <u>Stonehenge</u>.



They are still uncovering the secrets of Stonehenge and on the BBC iplayer you can watch <u>Stonehenge: The Lost Circle Revealed</u> with Prof Alice Roberts. This follows a decade-long historical quest to reveal a hidden secret of the famous bluestones of Stonehenge.

They are the only mammals wholly-covered in scales and they use those scales to protect themselves from predators in the wild. If under threat, a pangolin will immediately curl into a tight ball and will use their sharp-scaled tails to defend themselves.
