<u>Facts</u>

- Portuguese is:
  - $\circ~$  the  $6^{\rm th}$  most spoken language in the world
  - the 2<sup>nd</sup> most spoken language in South America
  - and the **most spoken** language in the Southern Hemisphere
- Brazil is the largest country in South America in both size and population
- Portuguese, Spanish, French and Italian are all Romance languages
- They're called Romance languages because they come from Latin, and were formed after the fall of the Roman Empire
- The days of the week in Portuguese are different from other Romance languages because of a powerful Archbishop in 6<sup>th</sup> century Portugal
  - He believed the original days, named after Roman gods, were disrespectful to Catholic belief
