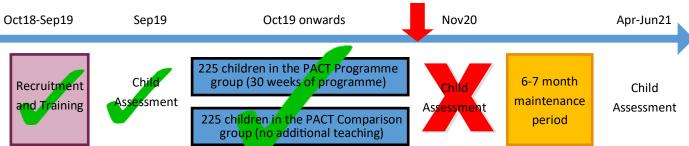
PACT Surveys
