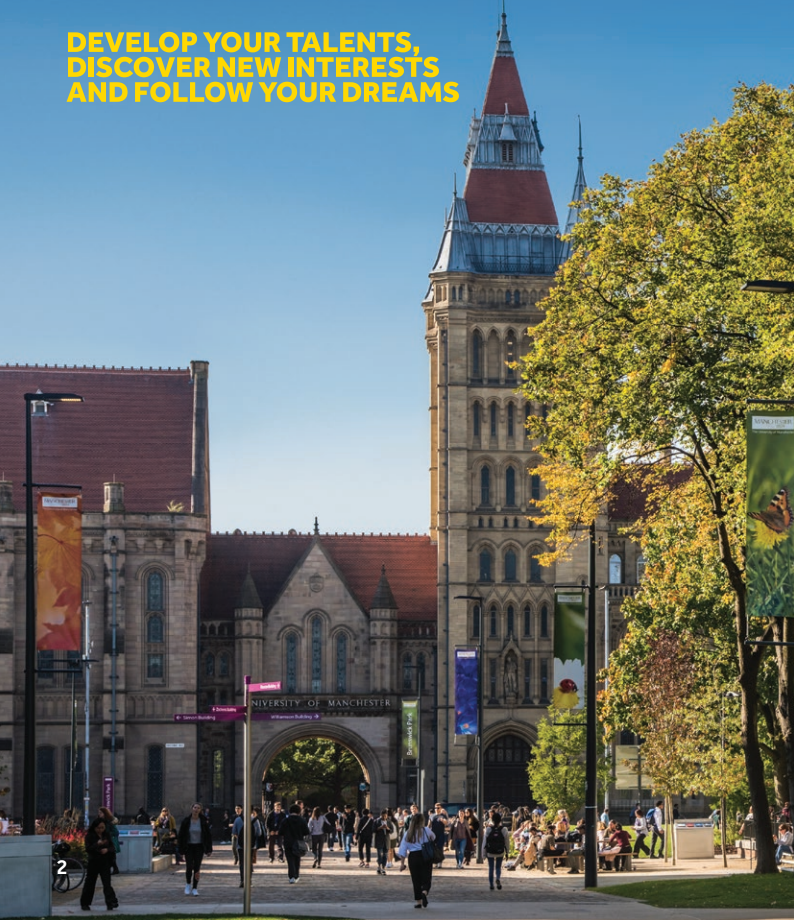

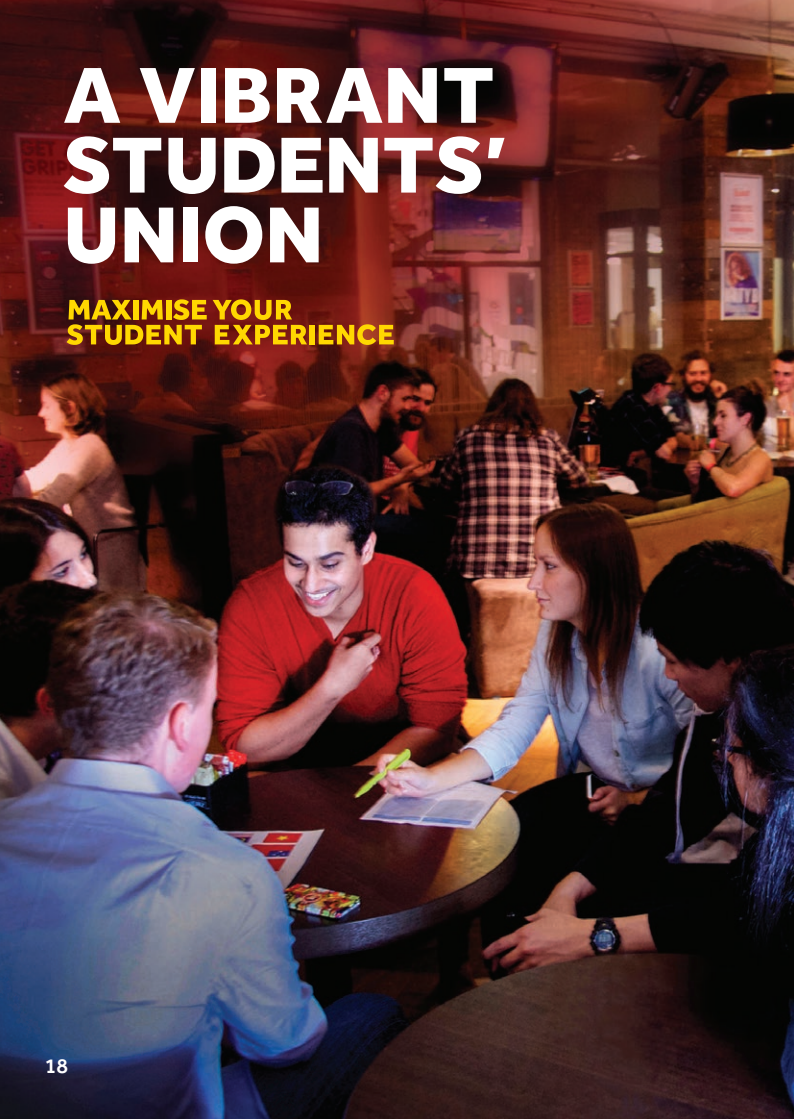

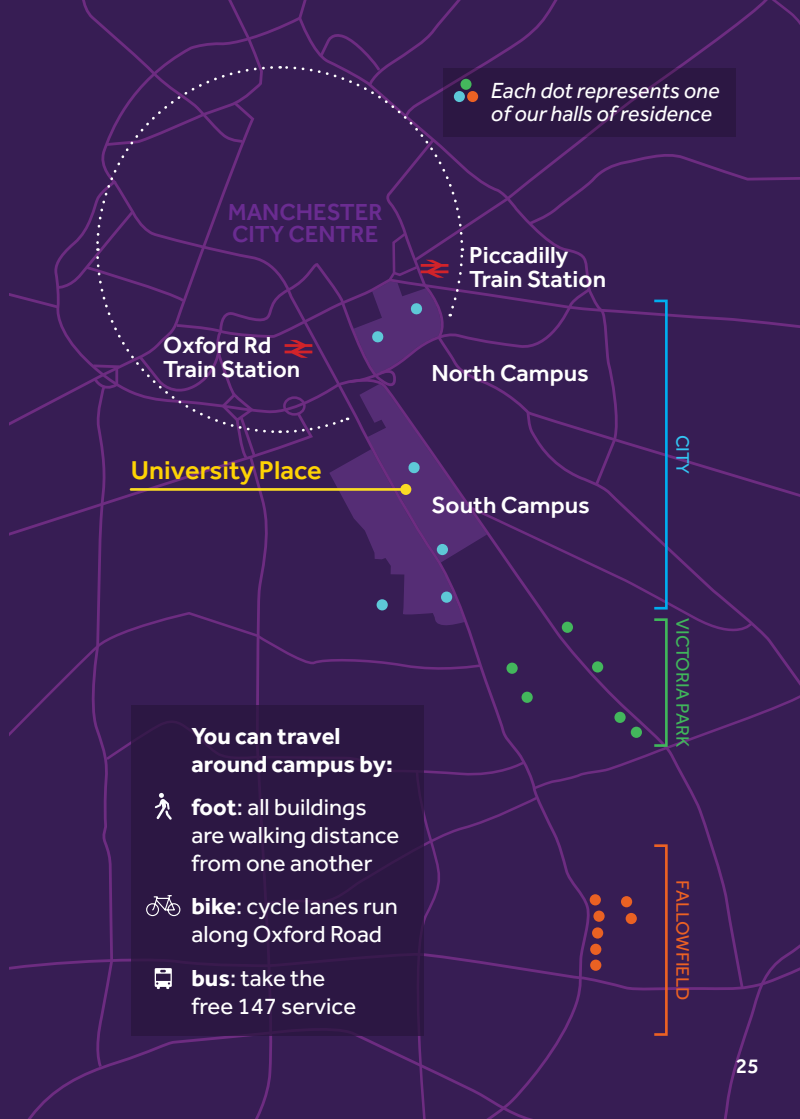

## CONTEXTUAL OFFERS

We know that everyone has different socioeconomic circumstances and educational opportunities. That's why we use contextual data alongside your application to build up a rounded view of your achievement and potential.

If you're a UK applicant under 21 and you meet our contextual data criteria, or you've been looked after or in care for more than three months, you'll be considered for a contextual offer. This is typically one grade lower than our standard offer.

We'll determine whether you meet the contextual data criteria using the information supplied on your UCAS form, so you don't need to do anything.

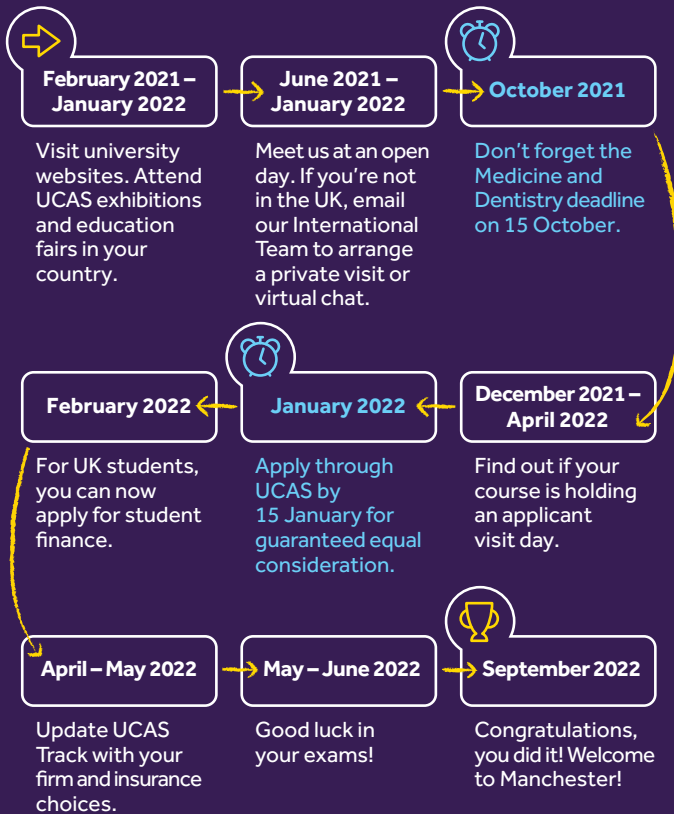
