

The Eli and Britt Harari Graphene Enterprise Award 2021: express your interest



The <u>Eli and Britt Harari Enterprise Award</u> competition, in association with Professor Sir Andre Geim, is now open to all students, postdoctoral researchers, and recent graduates of The University of Manchester. This annual competition, managed by the <u>Masood Entrepreneurship Centre</u>, encourages new ideas for graphene based enterprises.

Graphene, a two dimensional carbon material, is a gamechanging UK discovery and its properties make it one of the most important breakthroughs in recent memory. Graphene is a wonder material, with incredible electrical, with incredible electrical, mechanical and thermal properties.

Prizes of £50,000 and £20,000 will be awarded to the individuals or teams who can best demonstrate how their technology relating to graphene or other 2D materials could potentially be applied to a viable commercial opportunity.

Two of the Entrepreneurs Grant finalists who had presented business plans to be scrutinised by the judges Phil Hodari, CEO of The Pilot Group, and Dr. Jacob Salder of the <u>Masood Entrepreneurship Centre</u>, the awards' official patron - are from the University of Manchester - Dr. Mohammad El Hajj and Riddi Viswanathan. Mohammad and Riddi had previously been supported by MEC in developing their business ideas through the Start-up Visa scheme.

Care Homes Trial Biometric Certification for COVID Testing

The Warren Manor Day Care home in Blackpool has become the first in the UK to demonstrate an inclusive biometric certification system, which does not rely on smartphones, to ensure the safety of residents, staff, and visitors.

The <u>EN-Covid</u> passport solution, funded through a Government-backed <u>Innovate UK</u> grant, is a collaboration led by Enduring Net, a not-for-profit privacy specialist previously supported by <u>MEC</u> in last year's <u>ASPECT Success Accelerator</u> programme designed to help social scientists with innovative and marketable research ideas to get the training, support and funding to transform their ideas into a business or social enterprise.

The technology captures finger vein biometrics to enable secure, identity-enabled transactions, confirming identity as well as recording COVID-19 test status, giving a robust, secure, and fraud-proof system to ensure the safety of residents and staff.

<u>Enduring Net</u>, along with its collaborative partners in Blockpool and Fingo, have built a digital passport system that essentially all future 'track and trace' systems could be built on. Using the blockchain based SSI framework, the system not only encrypts the data used, it also complies with GDPR and EU data privacy laws in knowing where the data is at all times with the ability to delete that data instantly on request or by the individual themselves.

Manchester University Professor Ser-Huang Poon, Enduring Net founder and Project Lead commented: "The toll on the care sector has been devastating. Working with FinGo and Blockpool, Enduring Net wanted to create a digital passport that could help ease some of the pressures on the care sector and protect the most vulnerable. We've created a digital passport that provided certainty of results and, vitally, lets individuals have control over their personal data."

Entrepreneur Changing Youth Lives Through Dance

Christina Taylor, a former Manchester University MEnt. student, was recently featured in the American business magazine Forbes. Christina is an entrepreneur who has spent over a decade using dance to help transform the lives of young people. She founded a dance company Aim Sky High in 2013 to help socially mobilise children and young people and address social issues through the medium of dance. Aim Sky High has gone from 23 children initially to over 200 in the performing arts school and the company works with an average of 500 school children a week. The school boasts current European and World Streetdance Champions.

The company also provides additional free of charge community dance sessions in the deprived areas of Greater Manchester.

In June 2019, Christina then stated the <u>Aim Sky High Talent</u> agency to manage young creative talent.
