## Timbi World - Play for Fun. Make a Difference in the Real World.

Ricardo Climent, Professor of Interactive Music Composition at The University of Manchester, has been developing his social venture <u>Keep•lt•Human</u>, a game ecosystem for digital altruism, after participating in the <u>ASPECT Success Accelerator</u> last year.

<u>Keep•lt•Human</u> adds music and fun to digital fundraising to connect a new generation of people with the ownership of social challenges and has now launched the first philanthropic game: <u>Timbi World</u>.

In this game the rewards that players unlock during the game translate into rewards that are unlocked in the real world by unlocking the in-game currency of 'rhythmic energy' to exchange for charitable donations. For instance, if you exchange your rhythmic energy for an in-game skateboard you are helping <u>Timbi World</u> donate an educational skate pack to Maputo Skate in Mozambique, Africa. Through <u>Timbi World</u>'s efforts with the Maputo Skate Project hundreds of children are now able to access a skate sporting program to keep them away from gang culture, substance use, and other crimes.

The ASPECT SUCCESS programme enabled social scientists transform innovative and marketable ideas into a business or social enterprise.

Ricardo commented on his experience of participating in the programme: "The Aspect Success 2020 accelerator catapulted my academic research in music to places where I could not anticipate. I built from scratch and spun-out <u>Keep•It•Human</u> during the Success programme, a social venture which provided me with a boost of confidence to push social value at the forefront of my research agenda.



Almost any academic I know in the Humanities and the Social Sciences wants to make a difference on people's lives and make a better world, especially in the current climate. However, this is something that needs to be clearly articulated in research terms and it's hard for individuals. Aspect Success is the exact tool and entrepreneurial framework that I was looking for, which allowed me to navigate the transition between academic research and entrepreneurship. Their team is fantastic.

As for life after Aspect Success accelerator, my team and I have continued to develop and shape our value proposition. We've been working flat out on extending <u>Timbi World</u> MMO with new content but also iterating the conversion from virtual-to-real goods with new variants inside the videogame. We've been talking to various people in the videogame space, from the legal side of things (on trademarks, IP, music copyrights), to the fun staff and crowdfunding. Created new alliances with music charities and increased our presence on social media, festivals and conferences. We presented our proposition at places such as, the Mantis Festival in UK, ZKM in\_sight in Karlsruhe, Germany and in March at the TAMA Festival in Tokyo, with summer follow ups in Cardiff and Corfu."
