Title of SessionSubject Spotlight: Geography - Palm Oil – the Power and the ProblemDescription:Starting in your shopping basket, we will follow the story of palm oil and visit the factories, boardrooms, parliaments and
jungles it has been through on its journey. We will look the different impacts that the palm oil trade has on people and places
around the world, and consider the role that we ourselves will play in writing the next chapter of the tale.

00:02:32 - 00:07:02	Activity 1	Choose 9 volunteers (or adapt accordingly) to hold a shopping basket item at the front. Pause the video at 00:03:35 and allow class to vote on whether the item includes palm oil. Teacher counts the vote and volunteer stands on corresponding side of the board. Pause video at 00:04:50 and student volunteers should read out the clues on the back of their items.	'Palm Oil Shopping Basket' printed double sided (so some have clues on back) <u>OR</u> 'Palm Oil Worksheet (at home)' for students learning at home
00:07:03- 00:11:21	Activity 2	Pause the video at 00:07:41. Choose a volunteer to come and point to the map. Pause video at 00:08:14, students to think about what Cameroon and Indonesia/Malaysia have in common.	
00:11:22- 00:18:44	 Palm Oil Deforestation 	Pause the video at 00:14:32 and allow students to think about the consequences of forest loss.	'Palm Oil Worksheet (at home)' for students learning at home
00:18:45- 00:21:19	Banning Palm Oil	Pause video at 00:19:14 to allow students to answer whether or not they think palm oil should be banned. Ask one from each side what their reasoning is.	'Palm Oil Worksheet (at home)' for students learning at home
00:21:20 – 00:25:29	• Activity 3 & Extension	Students are in groups of 2-6, with the event sheets of one stakeholder (2 sheets) per group. Students discuss and rate the events. Pause the video at 00:23:49, students should have 10 minutes to complete this task. Pause the video at 00:25:18. Groups choose one of their events and come up with an extra detail which changes it from good-bad/vice versa. To close, take one idea from each group. Can choose a single event and explore how different stakeholders have responded to it.
