



Through HeLD we offer a series of workshops and support to help you design and plan course units and programmes. Our approach is based upon tried and tested work in the learning design field, and is accessible, practical and designed to fit around existing time commitments.

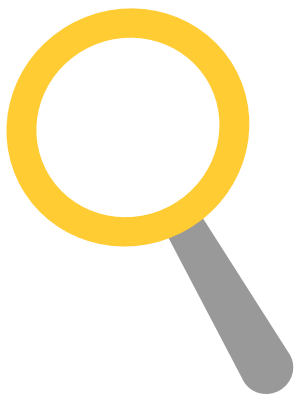
HeLD is available to all Humanities colleagues whether they are designing new courses and programmes, or making revisions to existing provision.

Working collaboratively with you and your course/programme team we will guide you through a process of identifying aims and outcomes, storyboarding your teaching and learning activities, and aligning assessment.

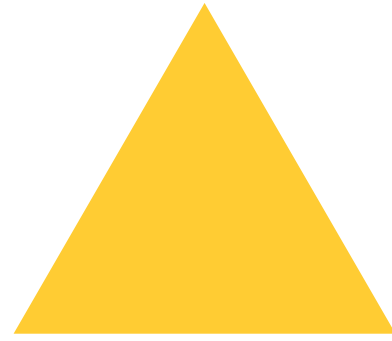
We will support you to make use of and embed technology where it is appropriate, and signpost further training and guidance where necessary.



Key Principles



Placing learning outcomes and student activity at the heart of course design.



Ensuring assessment is aligned with aims, outcomes and activities.



Encouraging the appropriate use of technology, embedding it into designs from the start.



Signposting support to enable colleagues to develop and run their own online activities.

How does it work?

There are 3 main elements to the HeLD process:

- a pre-meeting where we discuss overall objectives for engaging with the process, student characteristics, and timescales.
- an aims and outcomes workshop where we consider course/programme aims, the shape of the unit or programme, ILOs and assessment.
- a storyboarding workshop where we plan out activities and assessment based on the ILOs

Between each of these stages there may be work for course/programme teams such as liaising with relevant teams and colleagues, reviewing and refining plans and activities.

We also offer online activity development sessions where we can discuss approaches to selecting appropriate technology. We can also signpost to relevant training and guidance to support you in developing your skills and understanding of core UoM tools and technology.

Additionally we can support you through a review phase and an evaluation stage.

There is flexibility built into the approach, and we can focus on specific aspects such as employability or digital skills, or look at course units and programmes holistically. We can also work with you to devise and plan bespoke sessions to meet your needs.

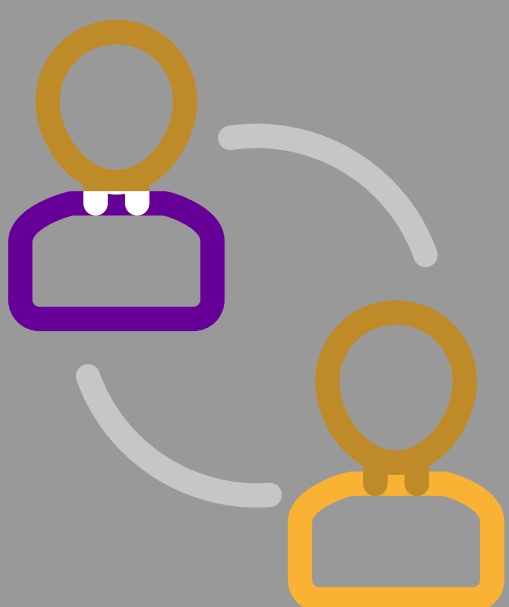
