

Guide: Different Video (Camera) Views in Collaborate Ultra

NEW: Gallery View - up to 25 videos on one screen.

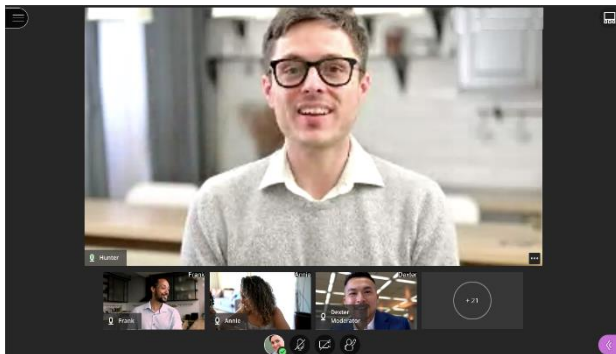
The number of videos you see depends on the support for your browser, device, and session size. You'll also see fewer videos if you have the Session menu or Collaborate panel open.

If attendees don't have their video on, their profile picture appears in their video space instead.

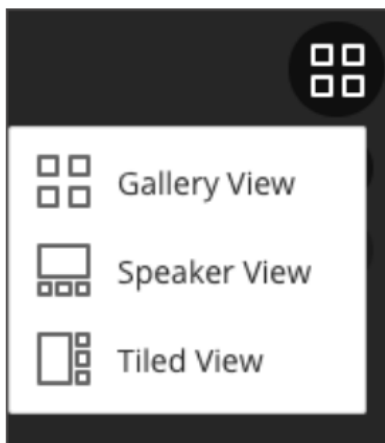
Which View: Speaker, Tiled, or Gallery?

Speaker View

Speaker view is the default view when you join a session.

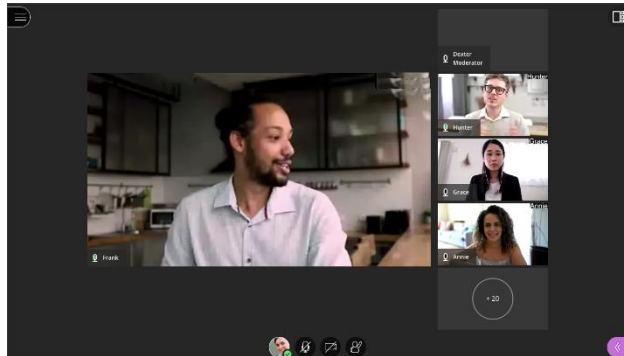


Select the **Change view** button in the upper right of the screen to switch between views.



Tiled View

N.B. Tiled view isn't available in Safari® on iOS or iPadOS at this time.

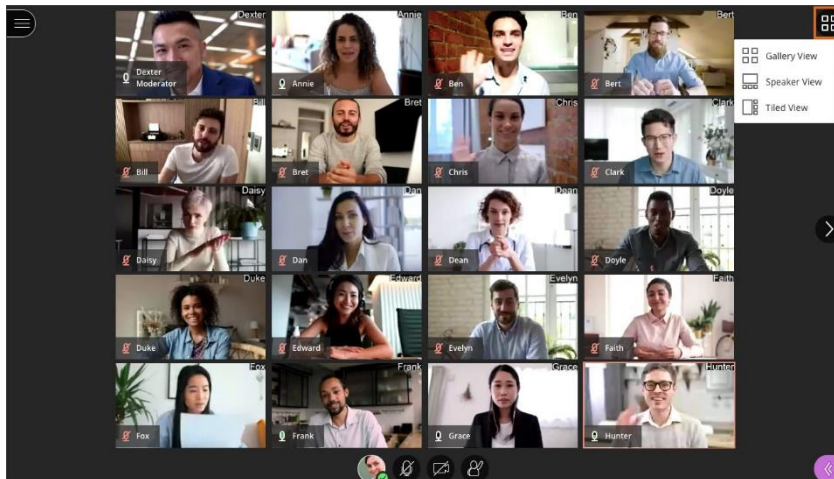


Tiled and Speaker views emphasize who is speaking. These views show **up to 4 videos** with **one video larger than the others**. This **larger video shows who is speaking** so you can see them more clearly. As the discussion unfolds, the **larger video changes** to match the **active speaker**.

The only difference between Tiled and Speaker views is layout.

Gallery View

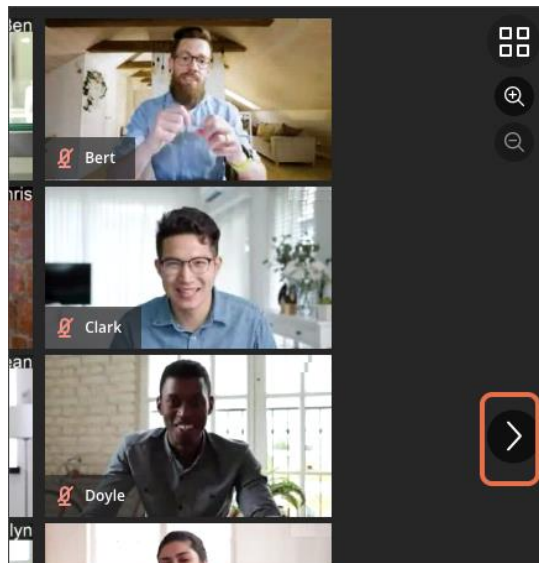
N.B. Gallery view isn't available in Safari® on iOS or iPadOS at this time.



Gallery view lets you see the most people at one time. With this view you can see **up to 25 attendees** on one screen.

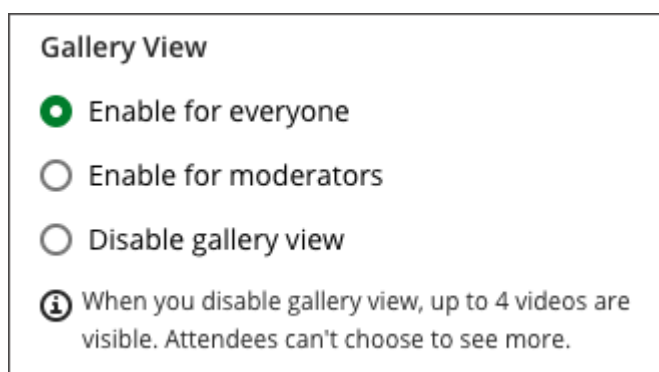
Attendee videos are in **alphabetical order**. Moderators appear at the start of the list on the first page.

Use the arrows on either side of the gallery to see more videos. As you move between pages, the speaker's video appears as a thumbnail in the bottom right corner of the main content area.



Use the Gallery view **settings** in Session settings to **decide how many videos** you and your students see at the same time.

You can allow everyone to see every available video (Enable for everyone). Or keep the full view for yourself and limit distractions for participants and let them see only 4 videos (Enable for Moderators). With this set up, you can see all of your students, but they can see only you and one or two others. Fewer videos can relieve some of the student stress tied to videoconference fatigue.



Pin a Video

When you pin a video, it moves the video to the **top of the list** and pins (fixes) it there. It doesn't change the number of videos you can see, just the order you see them in.

You can pin more than one video. Pinned videos appear in the order they were pinned. The first video you pin will always be the first video you see. Active speaker videos follow pinned videos.

Only you know who you pinned. Videos are only pinned in your own view. Nobody else sees who you pinned and the people you pin aren't notified.

Pinned videos stay pinned until you unpin them or leave the session. Pinned videos are pinned even when you go into breakout groups.

Use the Attendee controls in the Attendees list or in the lower right corner of a video to pin and unpin videos.
