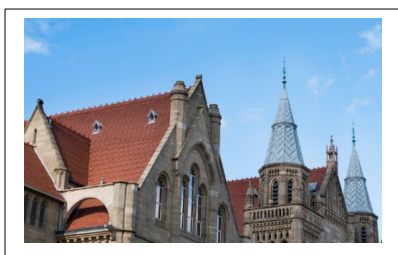

2. Policy/procedure updates from other areas of the University

- **Division of Campus Life: Student Conduct and Discipline/Advice and Response team**

Updates to the Summary Disciplinary Panel (SDP) and University Disciplinary Panel (UDP) Procedures

At the April 2021 meeting of the Student Conduct and Discipline Committee (SCDC), two new general misconduct penalties were approved, as follows:

Open to the SDP only: A partial or full suspension of physical access to a specific on-campus location (for example, a lab, or library location). It is expected that remote access will normally be permitted wherever possible, if appropriate.

Open to both SDPs and UDPs: A recommendation to the Head of Accommodation Administration Services to issue the student with a Notice to Terminate their accommodation Licence Agreement in University owned and leased Halls of Residence.

3. Peer Support

It's been a busy month in Peer Support! We've spent the last 4 weeks celebrating the successes of our Volunteers from this academic year during our Celebration Season.

- **Celebration Season**

We have been celebrating and showcasing all the work our PASS Leaders, Peer Mentors and Student Coordinators have been doing over the past year. Each week was themed around one of our Peer Support Values: Inclusive Community, Support, Engagement and Development.

Inclusive Community

With online learning and lack of face to face on campus events, our PASS and Peer Mentoring schemes have gone over and above this year in building an inclusive community for their students. Music Peer Mentoring piloted weekly 'Wellbeing Wednesday' drop in sessions, Chemistry have ran a virtual PASS event for prospective students, Physics PASS have set up a Women and Gender Minority PASS scheme, History Peer Mentoring ran Students of colour History network initiative and Fashion Business PASS developed a WhatsApp group specifically dedicated to help their first years find accommodation in 2nd year.

Support

Support was needed more than ever this year and our Volunteers really stepped up. Throughout the year, Volunteers who have gone above and beyond in their role have been named 'Peer Support Heroes' by others in the Peer Support Community 84 times! Collaborating with members of the Institute of Teaching & Learning, the session explored how to take care of ourselves whilst increasingly working online.



Engagement

Our Volunteers did not let being online dissuade them from running and taking part in events and socials to keep engagement up. We had Volunteering Champions assigned to each of the PASS and Peer Mentoring schemes to promote volunteering opportunities, as well as running a fundraising event and taking over the volunteering Instagram. Mechanical Engineering PASS ran to raise money during Movember, Aerospace Engineering PASS still carried out their Cowboy Murder Mystery social and Civil Engineering PASS still conducted a construction challenge of making catapults out of household items! We also sent six of our PASS Leaders as delegates to the SI-PASS Conference, the aim of which is to bring PASS Leaders from across Europe together to engage and motivate each other. Development

The development of our schemes was also not hindered. Chemistry PASS have introduced all kinds of new ideas this year to improve their community and further improve the support it provides to first years. Take a look at some highlights [here](#)! Geography PASS created two new roles within their scheme, First Year PASS Representatives and Covid Champions to provide support where they saw it was needed.

As part of our development opportunities within Peer Support we offer returning Peer Support Volunteers (students who stay on in one of our roles for more than 1 year) the opportunity to take part in LEAP. This year we had record numbers of our Peer Support Volunteers successfully apply and be awarded Associate Fellowship of the Higher Education Academy (AFHEA). We had 42 PASS Leaders, Peer Mentors and Student Coordinators achieve AFHEA status this academic year. In order to achieve this we needed more Mentors and Assessors and so 7 of our Peer Support Volunteers who achieved AFHEA status in Semester 1 acted as Mentors and Assessors in Semester 2.

Congratulations to all our Volunteers who achieved AFHEA status, it is well deserved and shows just how excellent our PASS Leaders, Peer Mentors and Student Coordinators are!

Massive thank you to our Mentors and Assessors, they were all fantastic and we couldn't have given this opportunity to the number of Volunteers we did without their help!

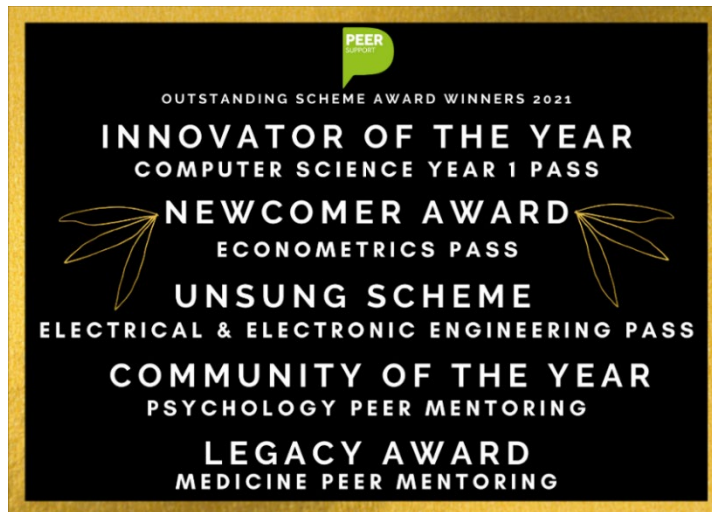


Peer Support's Annual Celebration Event

4. Student Partner Programme/Student Engagement

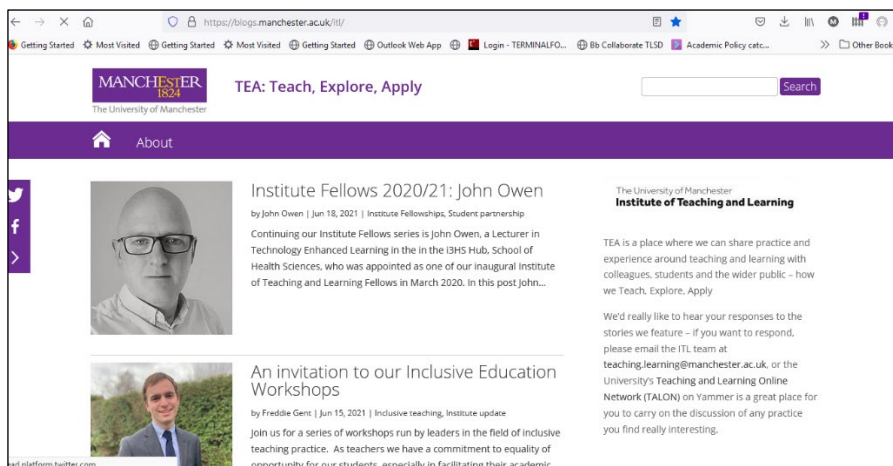
Review of the year – the Student Partner Programme is now one year old! In the past year, we have worked with over 92 Student Partner Interns, with an additional 83 in our recruitment pool for upcoming projects. From working on supporting Online and Blended Learning, Institute of Teaching and Learning (ITL) Fellow's projects, supporting the communications in the Student Experience Programme (SEP), and working on Diversity and Inclusion Projects. From the success of these projects, we will be recruiting Student Partners to work on a range of projects from Student 360, Flexible Learning Programme, and ITL Fellows projects.

- **Inclusive Teaching Workshops**

The Institute of Teaching and Learning, in collaboration with the Equality, Diversity and Inclusion Directorate, invite staff involved in the delivery of teaching and learning to a series of Inclusive Education Workshops.

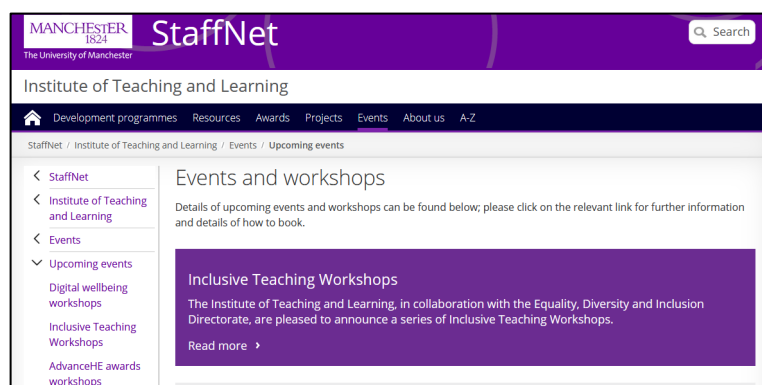
- **Digital Wellbeing Workshop**

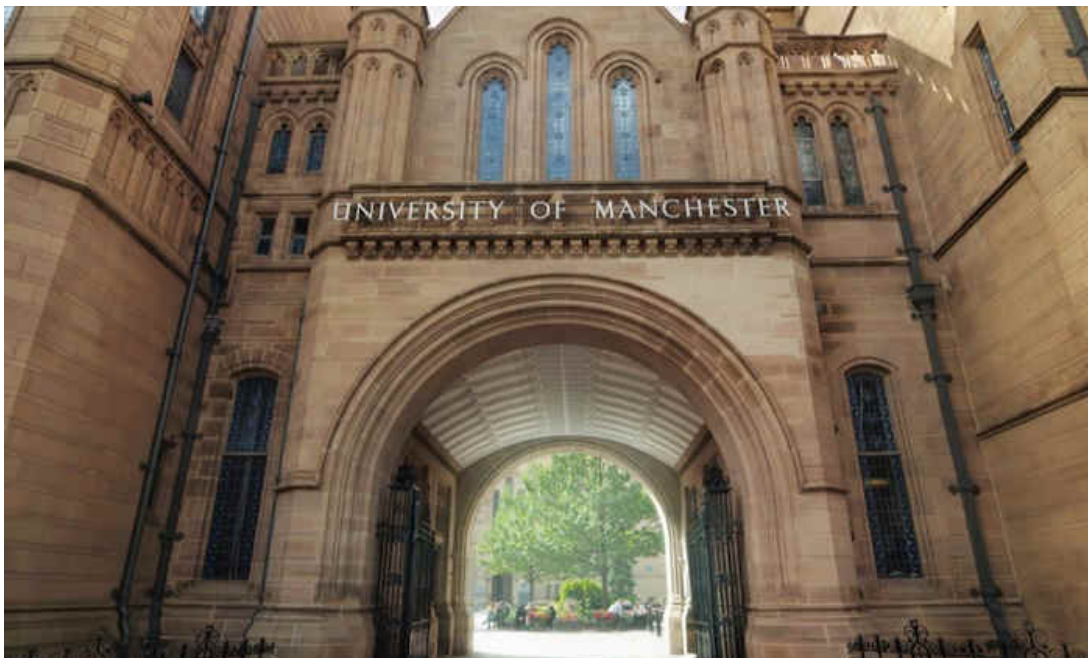
