

Guidance for your students in Dual Teaching

Is this replacing in-person teaching?

This is not replacing in person teaching and we still expect to have the majority of teaching happening on campus in classrooms. Dual teaching is to help support students or staff who are not able to come onto campus to join the teaching sessions and participate in class activities.

What should you do when you join the teaching session?

When joining the teaching session online, it is important to mute your audio, and have your name displayed as a courtesy to the teaching staff and your fellow students. Once teaching has started, your academic will let you know when you can unmute your audio.

General tips for students engaging with Dual Delivery teaching:

- For group work you will need headphones to join the online session to avoid feedback noise
- We cannot enforce cameras to be turned on; however, to strengthen community and collaboration, we encourage you to have your camera on. If you don't feel able to, have your name displayed for others to know who you are when you are contributing.
- We encourage you to ask questions but as a courtesy to everyone, raise your hand first.
- If you are a student in the classroom and wish to ask a question or contribute to the session, know that the microphones we are using are very sensitive and will pick up the audio but we still encourage you to speak clearly so that your fellow students online can hear you and respond appropriately.
- We understand you may not want to speak in the teaching session but still want to contribute. Could you offer to make the notes on the collaborative documents you are using in the class instead? Add comments for your group to Padlet or the collaborative document your group is using.
- We encourage feedback throughout the year. If you have any suggestions, please don't hesitate to contact us and tell us your ideas!
