Mitigating Circumstances Guidance 2021 - 22

Please know that you cannot apply for a coursework extension through this process. If you wish to apply for an extension to a piece of coursework, the form that you should use is the <u>'Coursework Extension Form-UG'</u>.

The deadline to apply for coursework has now passed. If you are applying for mitigation for the exams you need to complete the <u>'Exams – Mitigating Circumstances form'</u>.

You can find university guidance on the mitigating circumstances process <u>here</u> and <u>here</u> as well as guidance on the <u>SUs website</u>. The deadlines for semester 1 mitigating circumstances applications for this year are as follows:

Deadline for Semester 1 Exams Mitigating Circumstances – 4pm Monday 31st January 2022

What are Mitigating Circumstances?

Sometimes circumstances or events beyond your control may adversely affect your ability to perform in an examination/assessment to your full potential. The University defines mitigating circumstances as 'unforeseeable or unpreventable circumstances that could have, or did have, a significant adverse effect on the academic performance of a student'.

Possible mitigating circumstances include:

- significant illness or injury; or worsening of an ongoing illness or disability, including mental health conditions; (please see the following DASS webpage for examples of disabilities: http://www.dso.manchester.ac.uk/who-do-we-support/current-students/);
- the death or critical/significant illness of a close family member/dependant;
- significant family or personal crises or major financial problems leading to acute stress;
- absence from the University for public service, for example, jury service.
- IT issues there is guidance on this what to do in the case of such issues <u>here</u> but you
 may need to complete a mitigating circumstances application

How to apply and process

- You will need to complete a mitigating circumstances online application form (we no longer accept Word document applications). The application form can be found here (<u>'Exams Mitigating Circumstances form'</u>). You may need to complete both forms if both exams and coursework are affected (coursework deadline now passed).
- 2. You will receive an automatic response with further information and a copy of your application.
- 3. You will need to send your evidence via email to mitigatingcircumstances.sbs@manchester.ac.uk (further information on evidence below)
- 4. Your application will be considered at the mitigating circumstances committee which takes place **after the exams.**
- 5. You will receive confirmation as to whether your application has been accepted.
- 6. If you are required to take or are offered a resit, you will be contacted by the assessment team after the results are released.

Evidence

You must include any evidence that supports your request, such as:

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- Extracts from your medical notes (you can request these from your GP practice)
- Copy of prescription or photo of name label on prescribed medication
- Photo of labelled positive COVID-19 test result
- Appointment cards from medical unit or hospital admissions letter
- Confirmation text of medical appointment
- Communications from a school or care facility confirming that they are closed or the person you care for is unable to attend
- An obituary or letter from a family member, in the case of bereavement
- Police, security or insurance report
- Press or media report
- Internal confirmation of existing engagement with our counselling / Advice and Response service

For medical conditions we do **not** require a specific letter from your GP or healthcare provider. Instead you can provide a variety of alternative evidence to support your request: https://www.studentsupport.manchester.ac.uk/study-support/mitigating-circumstances/

In cases of bereavement we do **not** require a death certificate – evidence such as an obituary, or letter from a family member can be provided instead.

If you are registered with DASS, they will confirm with your School directly - you do not have to seek this evidence from them.

FAQs

Can mitigating circumstances add marks to my units?

No – mitigating circumstances can help in other ways but cannot add marks.

What are some of the outcomes when I apply for mitigating circumstances?

There are a number of outcomes, and this depends on what units you are apply for, what year you are in and the situation which has affected you.

Possible outcomes include:

- A new 'first attempt' of the affected assessment (1st and 2nd year only)
- A resit opportunity (1st and 2nd year only)
- Removal of late penalties (coursework only)
- Excluding the mark from the overall unit average
- Extending the limit of the boundary zone for degree classifications by a maximum of 2% (final years only)

I cannot provide any evidence, what should I do?

Please make sure to submit your application before the deadline. You can ask the student support team for advice on evidence by emailing mitigatingcircumstances.sbs@manchester.ac.uk. If it is medical evidence, please refer to the information above under evidence.

I am a DASS student, can I still apply?

Yes, you can still apply for mitigating circumstances if you have a support plan in place

What things do not normally count as mitigating circumstances?

- holidays, moving house and events that were planned or could reasonably have been expected;

assessments that are scheduled close together; en

- misreading the timetable or misunderstanding the requirements for assessments;
- inadequate planning and time management;
- an act of religious observance;
- consequences of paid employment;
- exam stress or panic attacks not diagnosed as illness
