Between 2017/18 and 2019/20 the School saw overall growth of students enrolled on SoSS
programs of $3 \%$ with the largest increase coming from the postgraduate-taught cohort with a $20 \%$ growth, followed by PGDR at 3\% while UGRD remained static. However, between 2019/20 and 2021/22 we have seen large growth in Undergraduate (29\%) and postgraduate taught (31\%) cohorts. This has been driven by much higher admissions than expected during the covid-19 pandemic. Postgraduate research on the other hand had dropped by $12 \%$ since 2019/20.

In line with admission trends, the headcount of unique students at undergraduate level on taking SoSS units has risen substantially in the past couple of years and the average number of students per course has also increased. At undergraduate level $74.2 \%$ of students enrolled on SoSS units are SoSS students, with the next largest groups being SALC (13.7\%) and AMBS (7.5\%). At PGT level 85.6\% of students enrolled on SoSS units are from SoSS with the next highest being SEED (8.5\%) and SALC (4\%) The average number of courses per student is also higher for SoSS students (which is to be expected), 6.82 at UG level and 7.54 at PGT.

The following two charts show the headcount of all unique students enrolled on SoSS units including those from other schools enrolled on our courses

As with previous years, the majority of SoSS students are domestic in origin with China accounting for the largest share of non-EU international students. Overseas student numbers have remained largely static since 2020/21 (2422) while EU student numbers have dropped from 548 while UK student numbers have grown from 3550



The School's ethnicity mix is significantly higher than national averages ( $87 \%$ white as of the 2011 census). The largest driver of this is students whose ethnic identity is Chinese and who make up $24 \%$ of the student body (versus $0.69 \%$ of the UK population). The majority of these students are International students.



Overall the School attracts more female than make students with female students accounting for 61\% (up from 59\% in 2020/21) of the student body across all combined academic levels. The highest proportion of female students within a cohort is Criminology UGRD where they account for $86 \%$ of the 283 students in that group. Conversely the lowest representation for female students is in the Anthropology PGRD cohort where they account for $43 \%$ of the 23 students in that group.

Data derived from active staff snapshot created in January 2022 - does not include casual staff. As of January 2022 SoSS has 543 staff, 431 of whom are Academic (including research roles) and the remaining 112 being in PS.



Topline staff representation by gender is slightly more representative of the total population than the student body is as of the 2011 census with $46 \%$ male staff and $54 \%$ female staff (as it was in 2020/21). However within roles and departments there are some quite large fluctuations.
