The Faculty of Biology, Medicine & Health at the University of Manchester wishes to announce the Dean's Prize fellowship scheme with the goal to provide pump-priming funds for Clinical, Applied Health and Pure Science researchers who are looking to apply for externally funded, prestigious fellowships, from UK national funding bodies such as UK Research & Innovation (UKRI), the Wellcome Trust (WT) or the National Institute for Health Research (NIHR).

This distinguished award is part of our programme focussed on research culture and offers pump-prime funding to promote the careers of aspiring academic researchers by bridging that difficult career gap between excellent postdoctoral researcher and research independence. We are offering salary plus support costs for two years. Applications for an external fellowship will be expected by the end of the 1st year, or early in the 2nd year. On ongoing support fellows will be expected to secure substantial funding for their research and complete research outputs of international excellence. It is likely that successful candidates will have clear intellectual links to current faculty members in order to benefit from appropriate mentorship, advice and support.

The award is available for Clinical, Applied Health and Pure Science applicants as a stepping stone to intermediate or senior level fellowship. All applicants should already hold a PhD. While flexible, in broad terms, we anticipate pure science/applied health applicants will have 3-7 years of postdoctoral experience. Hospital-based medical applicants will be about to complete or have just completed clinical specialist training or equivalent. For the latter applicants, the University of Manchester will support basic salary up to 0.5 full time equivalent (FTE) with the remaining 0.5 FTE salary reflecting clinical duties by the most appropriate NHS partner of the Manchester Academic Health Science Centre (MAHSC). This clinical component of the salary needs to be agreed in principle by the relevant NHS Trust/MAHSC Partner prior to submission.
