Project Outline

The candidate will be involved in the revision and further development of toolkits to equip participants to use Excel for social analysis.

The existing toolkits were developed for Q-Step students in Manchester and have been revised to support undergraduate teaching. They make use of datasets derived from the 2011 census and World Bank data.

The first task will be to update these to use the 2021 census and latest World Bank Data.

The candidate will then be encouraged to develop further material covering their own interests and to produce promotional material for the resources.
