Application Criteria

Essential:

- An ability to interrogate and visualise a range of datasets, mainly in Excel
- Excellent spoken and written communication skills
- A willingness to learn quickly about a new policy area and data, and manage a diverse workload effectively

Desirable:

- Some knowledge of labour market, economic and skills issues
- An ability to process data in R will be valuable, as will an ability to use Tableau

During your fellowship, we will need your support to refresh the Labour Market and Skills Review dashboards, which bring together data on employment and the labour market, pay, demand for skills, and recruitment. This will mean analysing a diverse range of datasets, helping us to visualise trends and convey important information to non-technical audiences.




