Project Outline

The five GM HE institutions and Greater Manchester Combined Authority (GMCA) have committed to delivering a Civic University Agreement (CUA)

https://www.greatermanchesteruniversities.org/. The agreement commits the five universities and GMCA to work together to be active anchor institutions and a catalyst for inclusive growth across the city region. The CUA focuses the work of the CUB (Civic University Board) on five themes:

Education & Skills

Reducing Inequalities

Jobs & Growth

The Digital Economy

Creative & Cultural Economy

It is proposed that mapping is undertaken to help the CUB understand the current strengths, impact and reach of the Universities' work on the five themes identified in the CUA. The results of the mapping exercise will be used to baseline current data available, analyse available data, drive collaboration, enable the CUB to operate on a strengths-based approach, understand the reach, and identify gaps in current activity.

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Practical Considerations
