Selection Method

Interview (preferably remote)

Application Criteria

Essential:

- Interest in economic justice and relevant public policy areas
- Ability to work independently
- Good analytical skills
- Proficiency in Excel, Outlook and Word and good analytical skills

Desirable:

- Ability to use statistical software to perform basic analysis and to produce charts and tables
- Data visualisation skills
- Good writing skills and ability to explain statistical results clearly

Project Outline

The successful candidate will be engaged in a research project that seeks to understand the drivers of the current cost of living (inflation) crisis and to develop policy responses to it.

This may include topics such as:

- Universal credit and welfare
- Decarbonisation and energy demand
- Macroeconomics
- Mark-ups and market power
- Taxation

The successful candidate will work with a Senior Economist based in our Centre for Economic Justice to produce innovative and fresh analysis to analyse economic trends, assess policy proposals, and evaluate the government's policies and commitments. The research produced will directly contribute to IPPR reports and our media work.

Practical Considerations

Ideally the work will be carried out via a mix of online remote work with in-person work in our London office 1-2 days/week. But coming into the office every day or working remotely every day are also feasible.
