Record demand for University places

University admissions 2021: Record number of students set to go to uni this autumn

A record number of students are set to go to university this autumn, with applications and offers both up, the admissions body Ucas has said.

As of 30 June, the final deadline to apply to up to five courses, there were 682,010 applicants – up by 4 per cent on 2020.

In total, they made 2,955,90 applications, up by 6 per cent on last year, resulting in 1,998,690 offers from universities and colleges, up three per cent.

The number of British 18-year-olds aiming to go to university directly from school continues to increase at a record pace, according to figures that show a surge in applications this year.

The number of school-leavers applying for undergraduate courses starting in September increased by another 5% at the initial January deadline, faster

2022 hardest year 'in living memory' to enter UK medical school

Heads say government must increase number of doctor trainee places to avoid NHS 'disaster' in 10 years' time

Medical school heads say this is the hardest year "in living memory" for Alevel students to get a place to study medicine, with several thousand high-achieving applicants left without a place. 

Internal Environment

UoM Admissions Position

- Overall applications for undergraduate study have increased 5% relative to last year.
 - Applications from home UK-domiciled students increased by 3%
 - Applications from international students increased by 9%
- Greater proportion of students accepting Manchester as firm choice

UoM Confirmation Strategy

- All students meeting the conditions of their offer will be accepted.
- Absence of Student Number Controls gives us flexibility to admit students who have narrowly missed entry requirements in a small number of discipline areas.
- Will be flexible where possible but need to mitigate impact of over-recruitment on the staff and student experience.
- We will seek to maximise our recruitment of WP students given the disadvantages many have faced throughout the pandemic.
- We expect to make targeted use of Clearing.



UCAS Results Embargo

The UCAS Embargo is a period of time where we have received results from awarding organisations before they have been released to students.





Confirmation

- If an applicant has met the conditions of their offer we <u>must</u> accept them.
- Applicants who have received a contextual offer will be confirmed against the lower grades in their offer.
- Applicants who miss the conditions of their offer may initially be put on hold while the university considers its overall numbers.
- Some applicants may still be on hold on results day if they have other conditions to meet. They are welcome to contact us for assistance.
- Applicants must meet their offer conditions by the 7th of September


MAP (Manchester Access Programme) and MDAS (Manchester Distance Access Scheme)

Appeals

- A web form is being provided for applicants to notify us if they intend to appeal their grade(s).
- Applicants will receive a confirmation email once they have submitted the form.
- Places will be honoured if applicants receive a positive appeal outcome and subsequently meet their offer conditions by 7th September.

Clearing

- Opened on Tuesday 5th July (early clearing).
- Clearing landing page live on our website with lists of vacancies.
- Main vacancies will be published at 5pm on 17th August (TBC).
- Applicants can't refer themselves via UCAS during the embargo.
- On A level results day, applicants can add a Clearing choice from 3pm.



Decline my place

UF applicants who no longer wish to take up their firm place can release themselves into Clearing between 5th July and 7th September.

This is done via UCAS by clicking 'Decline my place' when they log in:





What happens next?

Clearing Accepts

- Offer letters will be sent via email to those accepted in Clearing.
- Applicants will also be invited to complete Criminal Convictions Declaration and Right to Study.

Accepted in Confirmation

- Applicant now Unconditional Firm following results.
- Applicants invited to complete Right to Study and may also have an outstanding Criminal Convictions Declaration to complete.
