Are you an international student graduating on or before September 2023, looking to start your own business in the UK?



The University of Manchester is an endorsing body for the Startup Visa, endorsing recent graduates in their entrepreneurial pursuits at the end of their Tier 4 visa.

Applications for Start Up Visa endorsement will open on **Monday 16 January** and close at 12:00 pm. (midday) on **Friday 10 February**.

The new businesses will need to be innovative, with a clear sustainable competitive advantage over existing provision. They will need to be scalable, with potential to create substantial jobs and growth not just in the UK but abroad as well. Applicants will also need to be able to demonstrate that they have the necessary skills and competencies to run the business.

MEC Eli and Britt Harari Enterprise Award winner secures significant investment

Congratulations to Dr. Christopher Bullock and Dr. Richard Fu and the team at QV Bioelectronics who recently secured significant investment to further develop their cutting-edge technology with the aim of delivering transformative outcomes for glioblastoma patients.

In 2018 the company, then known as Honeycomb Biotechnology, was awarded the prestigious £50,000 Eli and Britt Harari Enterprise award.

This annual competition, managed by the <u>Masood Entrepreneurship Centre</u> (MEC), encourages new ideas for enterprises involving graphene and other 2D based materials.

The investment marks another successful outcome for the Northern Gritstone fund.

### Start-up News

Recent grant successes for University of Manchester ventures that have been supported by the Masood Entrepreneurship Centre include:

- Graphene Innovations Manchester, a company spun out from The University of Manchester led by alumnus and entrepreneur Dr. Vivek Koncherry, winner of the 2021 Eli Harari Graphene Enterprise Award, received a £49.9k grant from UKRI as part of the FLAWLESS project. The project aims to develop a new manufacturing technique based on a multi-nozzle, traversing winding head for filament winding enabling production of composite high-pressure vessels with significantly reduced weight and production speeds. This technology is aimed at meeting the rapidly increasing demand for hydrogen storage tanks, acting as an enabling technology for the UK to meet its ambition is to gain a 5GW of low carbon hydrogen production capacity by 2030.
- KOKU Health, founded by Dr. Emma K Stanmore (Reader, Healthy Ageing Research Group, The University of Manchester), is a digital health system which is helping older adults to age well, reduce their risks of falling and take control of their health. UKRi awarded a £50.0k grant to enhance and develop the platform.
- Fotenix, founded by engineering graduate Charles Veys, received a £228k grant
  as part of a project developing a combined imaging, spore sensing and robotic
  application platform, to improve the precision application of fungicides and
  biopesticides.
