



I think the range of expert teaching available. The lecturers are leading academics which not only means they are enthusiastic about their work, but you know you are really learning from the best. They provide you with support and for me, they really pushed me to achieve higher.

When I talk to people from other universities they are shocked when I say that we have learnt how to code in a programme called R and that for my dissertation I am analysing tweets. This just shows that Manchester really offers a wide range of topics and really puts you ahead of others.

### What advice would you give to those considering studying at Manchester?

Use the help available to you. I remember so often people were struggling with a module or an assessment but didn't go to the lecturer. Their doors are always open and getting their advice really helped me to advance in my degree.

Also take advantage of the opportunities around you, apply for volunteering in different areas of the Criminal Justice System; this gives you an insight into not only what career may suit you but will really help you with your studies and applying for jobs.
