Organisation and Team

Manchester City Council – Performance, Research and Intelligence (PRI)

Selection Method

A short CV and cover letter, followed by an interview

Application Criteria

Essential:

- An ability to analyse a large qualitative data set using excel
- Excellent spoken and written communication
- A willingness and keenness to learn new skills and understand the context of this work

Desirable:

- Experience of presenting data in a visually engaging way
- Experience of financial or statistical modelling

Project Outline

Manchester Adult Social Care services are part way through a large scale and ambitious change programme, <u>named Better Outcomes Better Lives</u>, aimed at enabling our residents who require social care support to continue to live independent and healthy lives.

A key part of this change programme is embedding the use of Technology Enable Care (TEC) to support care needs and delivery.

This role will support the research and analysis of existing datasets to provide the understanding and opportunities of utilising TEC within Adult Social Care service. The analysis will seek to answer key questions including:

- who currently uses TEC as part of their care support?
- What are their support needs and characteristics?
- What type of TEC do they use and how much does that cost?
- What is the opportunity for TEC and can we use that data to predict future demand and costs of providing TEC in Manchester?

Once the analysis is complete there will be the opportunity to present findings to a range of staff from across Manchester City Council.



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Practical Considerations

The internship will be able to work in a hybrid way with the placement lasting up to 8 weeks.

To make the most of the experience, we'd like you to be able to work from our city-centre office for at least part of the week, with the option to also work from home. We'll provide you with a laptop for the duration of your placement

Supporting Information
