Project Outline

We are seeking a Data Fellow to contribute to a report into Road Pricing in the North of England.

The report will explore different methods of road pricing and predict what the impact would be across a range of scenarios if different forms of this policy idea were implemented.

The data fellow will conduct a review of current data, exploring current transport demand and usage in addition to understanding the effect of existing transport taxation policies on behaviours and revenue to HM Government.

Working with the Chief Economist the data fellow will also explore international comparisons and work to model the impact of different policy recommendations.
