Customer Services

The SafePod

Have you ever wondered what the big box that looks like a bank vault in the Customer Services Admin area is?

It's a <u>SafePod</u>.

SafePod is a standardised safe setting that provides the security and controls for data that requires secure access. A SafePod includes a door control access system, CCTV, a researcher area for dataset analysis, a secure IT cupboard and a height adjustable desk.

Researchers can use the SafePod to access datasets for their research, if the datasets contain highly detailed and sensitive information about individuals (or households, organisations, etc.) that risk being disclosed. The SafePod provides a safe, secure, and controlled environment that is required to access and analyse these datasets.

The SafePod at the University of Manchester went live in February 2022 and after a trickle of bookings last year, we have seen a significant rise since the turn of the year. We have been 70% occupied since the start of the year, rising to 83% in March.

Our SafePod users range from researchers based here at the University of Manchester, to those visiting for a conference and taking the opportunity to grab some valuable SafePod time whilst in Manchester.

We have eight SafePod co-ordinators within the Customer Services Team, whose main responsibility is to ensure the secure operation of the SafePod at all times. To become a SafePod co-ordinator, they have all taken DBS checks and passed an 80-question test – they don't allow just anyone to be a SafePod co-ordinator!

New Service: Student card collection

As of Monday, 3 April, students can collect a replacement student ID card from the Main Library Customer Services Desk. This service will be available for all students, Monday to Friday, 8am - 8pm and Saturday and Sunday, 9am - 5pm.



Library Living Room changes

Laura Earnshaw and Ria Sunga have been working together to update the <u>Library Living Room</u>, which is located by the Library Lounge. The Library created this space in Winter 2022 to offer a warm, comfortable and relaxing space for students.

Currently, the room has blankets, seating and boardgames. The space is well-used by students, but mainly as an additional workspace.

Some of our planned changes include adding soft furnishings, artificial plants, and additional lighting, to help create a cosy space, as well as painted walls and signage. With the inclusion of posterboards to delineate the space and create a student announcements board or 'community wall', it is hoped that the students will use the area as a recreational and relaxing space.




Workers' Playtime

A Decade of Digital Society

Digital Society turns ten this year and reaches another milestone with 100 students enrolled in Semester 2! Launched in 2012/3 as *The Digital Society,* the unit is available to all undergraduates via the University College for Interdisciplinary Learning (UCIL), and has seen a number of changes over the years (not least losing the 'The' in 2016).

Originally taught through on-campus seminars, *Digital Society* is now fully online and asynchronous. During the COVID pandemic, TLS were asked to run the course twice in order to meet demand for online teaching at a time when many units were not ready. Originally based in Blackboard, the course materials now form an open online publication on Medium – with most of its 850+ posts written by students.

The Library Student Team play an essential role, running the course podcast since 2019/20, and this year launching the first Student Team–led topic, <u>The Rise of Simulated Spaces</u> (by Sara and Salma), alongside another new topic <u>Chatbots and Questions of digital conversation</u>, from Bonnie.
