Our campus will also help you get the most out of your studies.

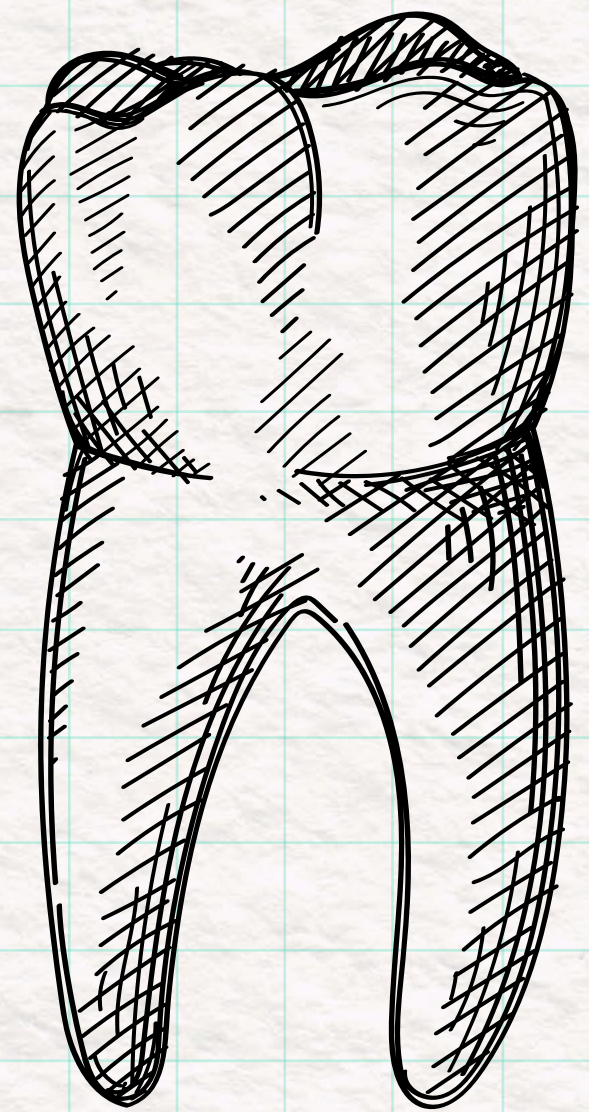

100 YEARS OF DENTISTRY AT MANCHESTER

1883

The Dental Hospital was founded to serve the dental side of the medical school by allowing staff and students to attend to patients unable to pay for private dental treatment. The Hospital's treatment rooms were open three evenings a week for the working poor who would otherwise lose wages if attending in day-time.



The Hospital was treating more than 10,000 patients per year, the great majority during the evenings.

1887

1900s



Several large donations during the early 1900s secured a site, and a new Victoria Dental Hospital was constructed next to the University Museum on Oxford Road.

1940

The new Dental Hospital opened but was later bombed during an air-raid in the Second World War. It operated without windows for much of the rest of the war, but it took on numerous war duties allocated by the Ministry of Health, including routine dentistry for all service personnel, evacuees, refugees, and war-related factory workers.

1972

The long-awaited redevelopment of the University Dental Hospital of Manchester was completed. The re-equipped Dental Hospital provided improved training, and specialists in relatively new fields such as plastic surgery and speech therapy were appointed.



1991

Manchester Royal Infirmary, St Mary's, the Royal Eye Hospital and the Dental Hospital became the Manchester Central Hospitals and Community Care National Health Service Trust.

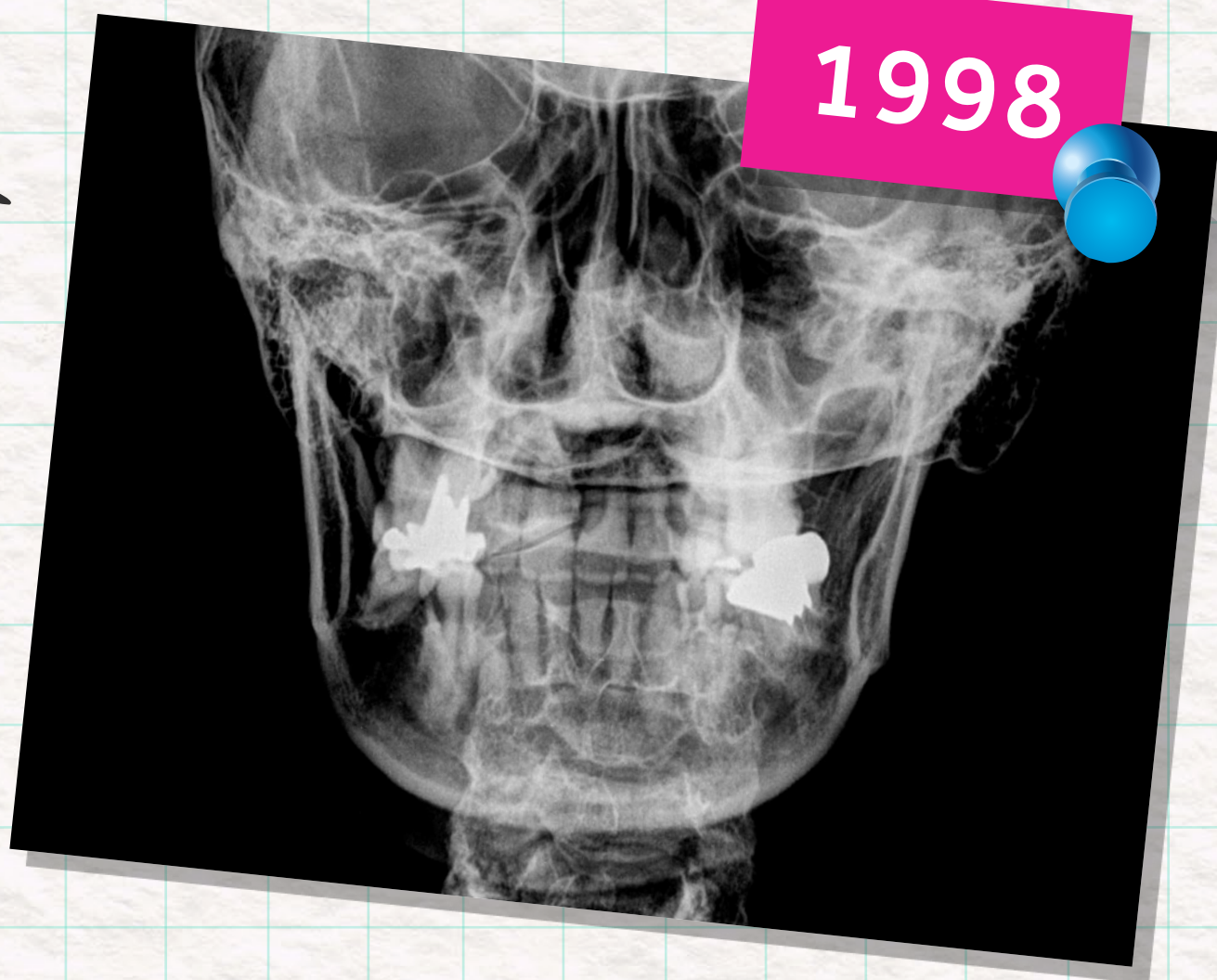
Mid-1990s



25% of all postgraduate dental students in England and Wales had passed through the University Dental Hospital's doors.

1998

A new educational centre opened. The Dental Hospital was nominated as the regional centre for the management of specialised cleft lip and palate services.



2009

Royal Manchester Children's Hospital opened. The majority of general anaesthetic treatment is now carried out here.

WHAT IS THE TEACHING LIKE?

The teaching has been great. There is a very low student-to-lecturer ratio, which makes interaction and involvement in lectures easy. There is the expectation of a lot of self-learning, and you get out of the course what you put in, but lecturers are always willing to help and answer any questions you have.

Layan Mehyar is a graduate of the MSc Orthodontics course at Manchester. Layan is originally from Jordan and has returned home since graduating from Manchester to work as an Assistant Professor in a dental school. She has also set up her own private orthodontic practice in Amman.

Layan talks us through her experience:

Oh Manchester! Four years later, yet still clearly, and undoubtedly, one of the best choices and experiences of my life.

Arriving in Manchester, I didn't really know what to expect, although I kept on hearing about the weather being 'unpredictable and wet'. I was pleasantly surprised to feel at home from the very first day. I discovered that I had joined a community of like-minded students, and proceeded to live through new experiences and develop new skills, all of which allowed me to grow as a person and equipped me to be a successful professional.

What I found unique about the course was the prominence given to implementing the latest and highest quality evidence into guidelines for our everyday work. A key foundation for sound clinical practice is to put into effect evidence-based orthodontics.

I was fortunate to be able to practice in two busy yet well-organised hospital departments; this offered the opportunity to manage the full spectrum of patients including treating complex orthodontic cases. Meanwhile, I was learning from working with some of the most experienced professors and clinicians in the UK.

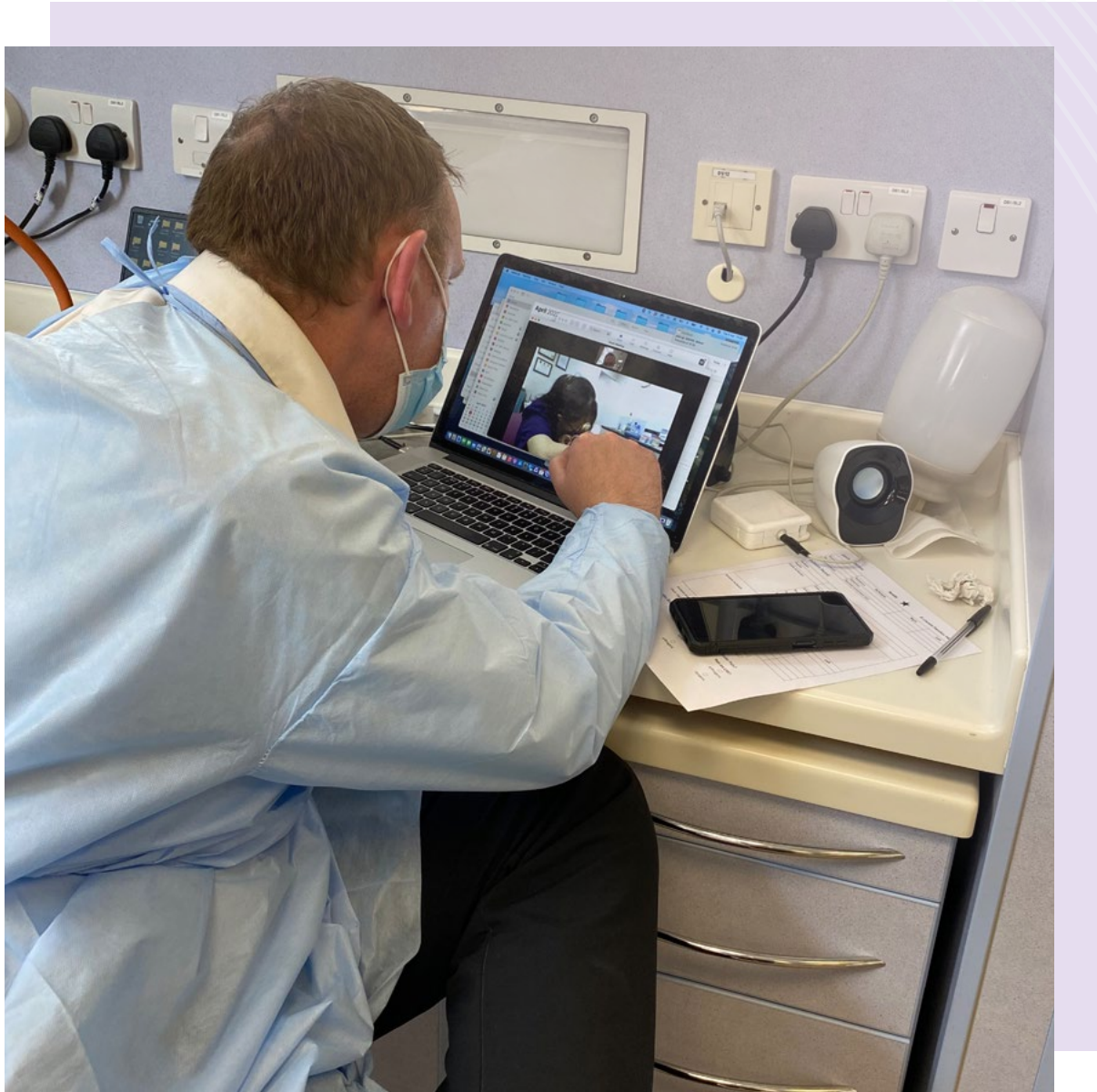

STUDY SHEDS NEW LIGHT ON BENEFITS TO CHILDREN OF WATER FLUORIDATION

Fluoridation of the water supply may confer a modest benefit to the dental health of children, a seven-year-study led by University of Manchester researchers has concluded.

"While water fluoridation is likely to be cost-effective and has demonstrated an improvement in oral health, it should be carefully considered along with other options, particularly as the disease becomes concentrated in particular groups. Tooth decay is a non-trivial disease, which is why measures to tackle it are so important. The extraction of children's teeth under general anaesthetic is risky to the child and is the most common reason for children between the ages of 5 and 9 to have a general anaesthetic."

MAKING A DIFFERENCE

IMPROVING DENTAL KNOWLEDGE AROUND THE WORLD

Dr Raj Ariyaratnam is the clinical academic lead for oral medicine and the lead for social responsibility in the Division of Dentistry.

For over a decade, Raj has led several local and global oral health initiatives, including linking different dental schools across the globe to Manchester to improve the knowledge base of dentists and doctors in war-affected areas such as his native Sri Lanka. As these initiatives grew and became more successful, Raj expanded his overseas work through an online platform that allowed him to lecture across the globe.

“Initially, we connected to Sri Lanka and because that was successful, we have branched out to other countries, including Nigeria, South Africa, Egypt, and Kenya.”

Raj has also initiated projects closer to home, including providing treatment to difficult to reach communities, a volunteer project to provide dental care to the homeless, underprivileged children and their families, and an initiative to take dental care to communities in their own languages to overcome barriers to accessing care.

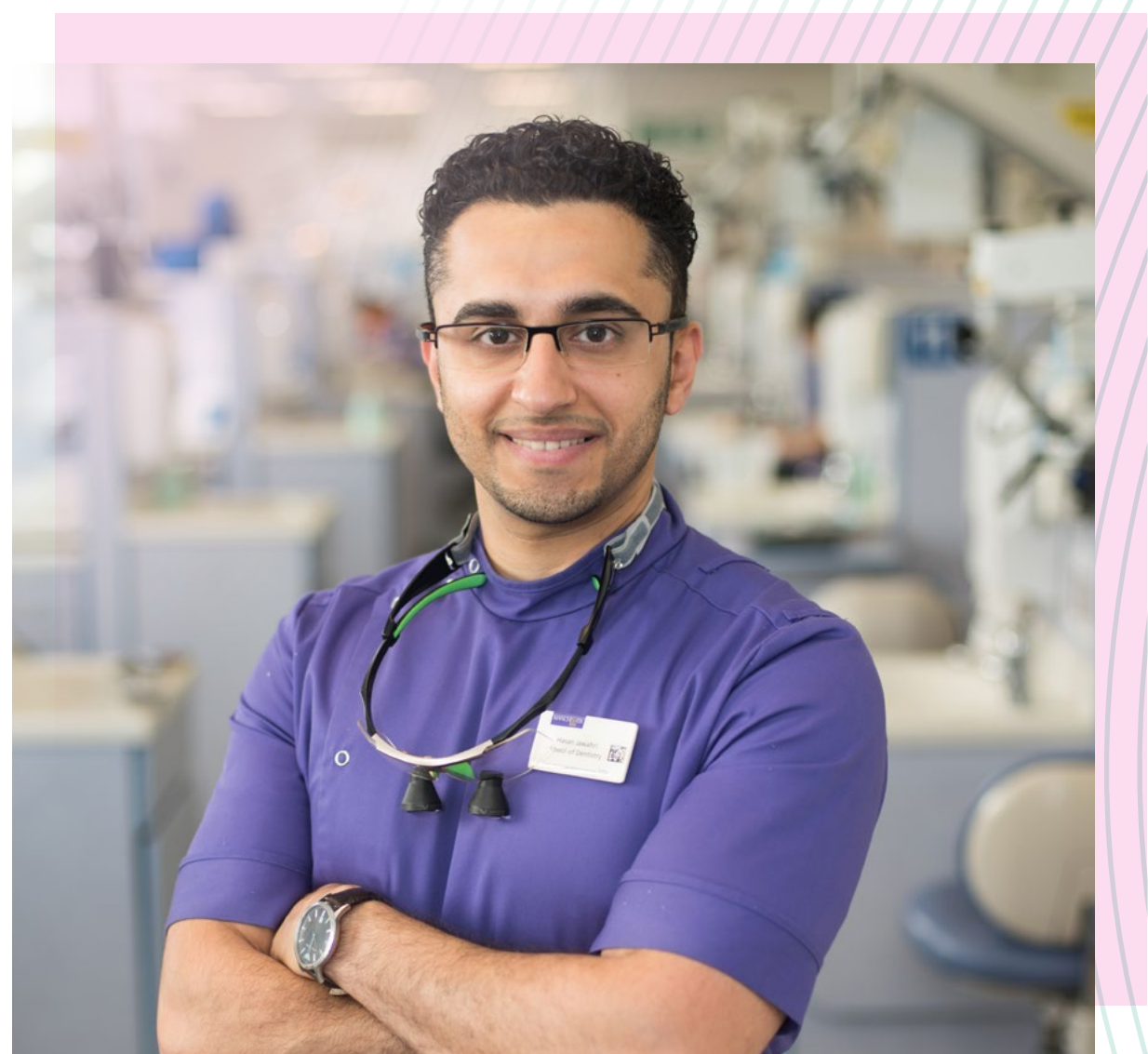
