Overall purpose of job

Student Ambassadors will play a key role in supporting the work of the UK Student Recruitment team, the Access and Success team, the Student Communications team, and Student Marketing team.

Key Responsibilities, Accountabilities or Duties of a Student Ambassador

- Facilitate and support a wide range of campus-based, online or virtual activities, including
 workshops and summer schools, aimed at promoting both The University of Manchester and
 Higher Education more generally to prospective secondary and post-16 learners and their
 parents/carers and teachers.
- Share your experiences of university with prospective students and their advisers in a positive and enthusiastic way.
- Deliver campus and facilities tours for prospective students and their advisers.
- Create online content such as blogs, videos and profiles to be used on websites and in prospective student communications.
- Provide administrative support to members of staff. This can entail access to confidential or sensitive information and Student Ambassadors will need to be aware of appropriate Data Protection protocols that must be adhered to.
- Assist with other tasks as directed.
