Hist31201 China and the West: The Age of Empire and Beyond (2023-24)

This is a level three module that focuses on China's relationship with Europe, Russia, America and Japan. We are interested in why they engaged with China and how their relationship shaped their own and Chinese histories. We began with Britain followed by the invasion of Protestant missionaries in the late 19th century when the "scramble for China" intensified and when more Europeans, the Japanese and the Americans, joined the game of empire. We study Chinese Diaspora and the rise of Chinese nationalism to explore how the Nationalist regime reached out to the West, and how the Communist regime dealt with them, especially Russia and the US during the Cold War. Sino-West relation is even more interesting to study in the post-Mao era as China has re-asserted herself on the international stage when she has not forgotten about the humiliation suffered during the so-called "century of unequal treaties". What can politics of history teach us about the future?
