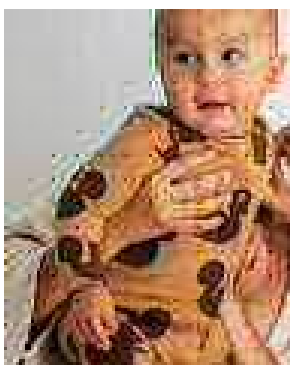
Healthify Africa

Healthify Africa is an evidence-based wellness platform developed by Lynda Odoh, an MPH student at the University and a winner in the Social category of the 2021 Venture Further Awards. The app is now available after piloting across hospitals in Nigeria.

With approximately 17 million people dying annually from Non-communicable diseases (NCDs) in Low and Middle Income Countries (LMICs), the app will empower users to make healthier lifestyle choices from the convenience of their phones and tabs.

For healthcare professionals, the Healthify App will minimize the missed opportunities for lifestyle counselling that happens as a result of limited consulting time and high work pressure from increasing patient load in a day-to-day clinic.

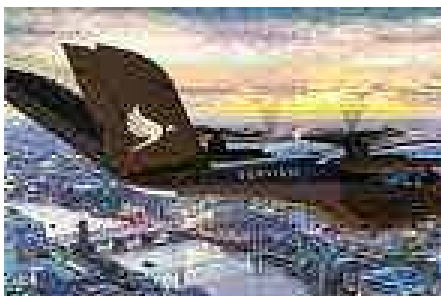

Reliability: why is it important and what could a career path in industry look like?

The Masood Entrepreneurship Centre ran an event with the Ministry of Defence, Atkins and the School of Engineering in April. Nick Barnett (CEng, FSaRS, DE&S Specialist Fellow), one of our speakers, is the Chief Reliability Engineer for Defence Equipment & Support (DE&S), the agency responsible for the provision and support of all equipment for the UK Armed Forces. Our second speaker Robert Smithers (MEng, MIMechE) is a Senior Reliability Consultant at SNC Lavalin's Atkins business and alumni from The University of Manchester. They discussed the use of technology that we use every day as civilians or in the military in Industry 4.0. They presented innovations and development of technologies such as Thales High-G Centrifuge and Vertical Aerospace VX4 and the importance of implementing reliability.
