WELCOME

Dear students.

We are thrilled to welcome you to the Bio-Science International Summer School (Bio-SISS) 2025, organised by the Faculty of Biology, Medicine, and Health at the University of Manchester. This prestigious three-week summer school offers a unique opportunity for undergraduate students from our partner universities to immerse themselves in the biological and biomedical sciences.

Bio-SISS 2025 will take place from Monday 21st July to Friday 8th August 2025. It is designed for self-motivated international students studying biological or biomedical sciences, and aims to provide first-hand experience in cutting-edge scientific research within a world-class learning environment enriched with British culture.

The University of Manchester has a strong international reputation, with 25 Nobel Prize winners, a 6th-place ranking in the UK, and 34th globally in the QS World University Rankings 2025. We are especially proud of our strengths in the Biological Sciences and Medicine disciplines. Additionally, the University is ranked 1st in the UK and Europe, and 2nd globally for social and environmental impact (Times Higher Education University Impact Rankings 2024).

Throughout the summer school, you will attend lectures delivered by our leading researchers, participate in workshops on science communication and career development, and enhance your research skills through hands-on experiments in our state-of-the-art teaching laboratories. You will also develop your English skills through teamwork and discussions, and strengthen your presentation abilities in oral, written, and poster formats, in an academic setting among your peers and Manchester staff.

Working in small groups, you will prepare a scientific poster on a topic of your choice, which will be presented on the final day before the closing ceremony. Certificates and small prizes will be awarded to the groups with the best posters as selected by a panel of academic judges. In addition to the academic programme, there will be plenty of opportunities to explore British culture through organised social activities. These include a day trip to Windermere in the Lake District, a city excursion to York, and a farewell celebration to mark the end of your summer school experience.

As the University celebrates 200 years of education and innovation, this year also marks the 7th anniversary of Bio-SISS. Building on the success of previous years, we are confident that Bio-SISS 2025 will be an enriching and memorable experience that leaves a lasting impact on your future studies and career.

We look forward to welcoming you to Manchester for an exciting and transformative summer.

EMERGENCY CONTACTS

HEALTH AND SAFETY

If you require urgent medical assistance, or a crime is currently happening, you must call 999.

If the incident occurs on campus, call the University of Manchester's security team (number on the back of your student card) on 0161 306 9966 as well. The security staff will be quicker to attend to the person in danger, has received first-aid training and will be needed to arrange for the ambulance to get to the right place. Similarly, if the incident occurs in your accommodation, please inform reception so that they can help.

If you have an urgent medical concern, but do not need medical assistance, you must use 111.

If you have been a victim of a non-emergency crime that has already happened, you need to report it by calling 101. Examples of such non-emergency crimes include stolen laptops, smartphones and mobile phones, minor traffic collisions, property damage or drug dealing.

If you are feeling ill and can wait for an appointment with the GP, please do so. This will require for you to have registered with a GP prior to taking the appointment, which is why we recommend you do this as soon as possible.


