UK Student Visa Application Form Guidance



This guide is for applicants and students who are eligible to apply for a Student visa from within the UK and will help with completing the online application form.

Please use this guide in addition to the information on our [website](#), which includes detailed guidance on both the application process and the supporting documentation you will need to submit along with the online form.

You must check that you have all the necessary supporting documents and that these all meet the Student route's requirements before completing the online application form. You also must have received a **Confirmation of Acceptance of Studies (CAS)** from the University before you can apply for a Student visa. If you are applying to start a brand-new course, then your school or department admissions team will create your CAS. If you are already a student at The University of Manchester and require a new CAS due to a course extension or transfer, your CAS will be created by the Student Immigration Team once you have completed a **Continuer CAS Request Form** issued by your department or school and returned this to them for processing.

If you are an applicant, you will be asked to review a 'draft CAS' in MyManchester and confirm what changes, if any, need to be made before it is formally issued to you. Continuing students are not required to do this, but you must still ensure that the Student Immigration Team holds a copy of your current passport.

The final version of your CAS statement, which includes the CAS number you will need for your visa application, will be emailed to your university email address. We are also working on making a copy available for you to view in MyManchester, although this is currently still in development.

When to apply?

When applying from inside the UK, you cannot apply for your visa any earlier than **three months** before course start date stated on your CAS. You must also ensure that you use your CAS to apply for a Student visa before the **latest acceptance date** on your CAS.

Note on Supporting Documentation

If the course you will be studying is at degree level or above, you should not need to provide evidence of the qualification(s) listed on your CAS as the basis of your course offer. The Home Office now relies on Higher Education Providers like The University of Manchester to assess applicants' academic ability directly.

Additionally, if you have been living in the UK with valid permission for **twelve months** or more by the time you will submit your application for a Student visa, you will be considered to already meet UKVI's financial requirements for the route and should not need to provide evidence of funds with your support documents.

IMPORTANT: You will be able to retain your passport while your application is being processed. However, if you travel outside of the Common Travel Area (UK, Republic of Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man) whilst your application is still ongoing it will be withdrawn. You are therefore strongly advised to delay any travel plans until you have received your new visa.

Step One: Pre-application Questions

You access the Student [visa application form](#) through the UK Visas & Immigration (UKVI) website.

You will first need to answer some questions which will assess your eligibility to use UKVI's ID check smartphone app to confirm your identity and re-use your biometric information.

If your answers to these initial questions mean that you are unable to use the app then you will be directed to complete a different application form where you will need to book and attend an in-person appointment with UKVCAS (UKVI's Commercial Partner) to provide your biometrics after submitting your application. If you are either unable to use UKVI's app, or choose not to use it, then you should refer to our other [application guidance](#) as the following steps will be different.

NOTE: You will not currently be able to use the app if you do not have a BRP (unless you are an EU/EEA/Swiss national and have a passport containing a biometric chip ). If you are a non-EU/EEA/Swiss national who has never received a BRP or who has since lost it then please refer to our alternative [application guide](#).

Step Two: Creating a UKVI Account (If Applicable)

If you are assessed as being eligible to use the app then you will be shown the screen below.

To use the app, you must have access to a smart phone which meets the necessary specifications stated. This can be a phone belonging to a friend or family member if your own phone does not meet the necessary requirements.

You can also choose not to use the app, if you wish to (although you are strongly advised to use it if you can) by clicking on the blue 'I do not have a phone that can use the app' link at the bottom of the screen.

If you do intend to apply using the app then click continue and you will be prompted to create or sign into an existing UKVI account.

NOTE: If you are applying with dependants and use the ID Check App, you and each of your dependants will need to complete separate applications. If you would prefer to submit a combined application, then you can opt to not use the ID Check App and follow our other [guidance](#). This will mean though that you and your dependants will need to attend a biometric appointment.

If you need to create an account, you will need to answer a few more questions relating to your personal details before the account can be created. You will also need to verify the email address and phone number you provide by inputting a 6-digit security code that will be sent to you.

After verifying your contact details, you will be asked to confirm the information you have submitted so far is correct. It is essential that the information you provide here is accurate otherwise you may encounter issues with your application.

Check you can use the app

You can use the app on:

- an iPhone 7 or newer models
- an Android phone with near-field communication (NFC)

Check the phone's settings to see if it has NFC. The phone has NFC if you can use it to make contactless payments.

If you do not have a phone

Ask a friend or family member if you can use their phone. No information is stored on the app or phone after you close it.

You do not have to apply on the phone - you can do the rest of your application on your computer or another device.

We will send your decision letter by email - this can be your email or someone else's. You do not use your decision letter to prove your status.

Create a UK Visas and Immigration account

To use this service, you need to create an account.

Once you have an account, you can use it to confirm your identity, apply and use other Home Office services.

What you need

You will need your:

- date of birth
- passport
- email address
- phone number

If you need to give someone application access so they can apply for you, you also need their email address and phone number.

Who can create an account

You can create an account for yourself or someone else in some cases - for example, your young child.

Sign in

If you applied before October 2020, you do not have an account (unless you applied to the EU Settlement Scheme).

To sign in, you need your identity document number and date of birth, and access to your phone or email.

Step Three: Logging Into Your UKVI Account

Once you have created your UKVI account, you will need to log back into it using the details of the ID document you used to set it up (Usually BRP) as well as your date of birth. You will then need to complete another verification which you can choose to be sent to your email address or phone.

What identity document did you use in your application?

If you have updated your identity document since you applied, you must use the details of the updated document to sign in.

- Passport
- National identity card
- Biometric residence card or permit

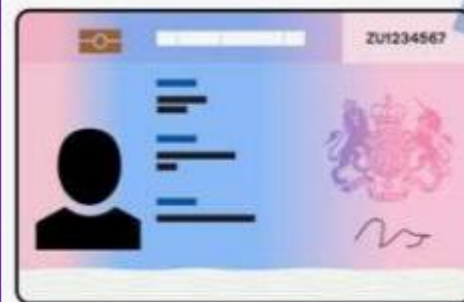

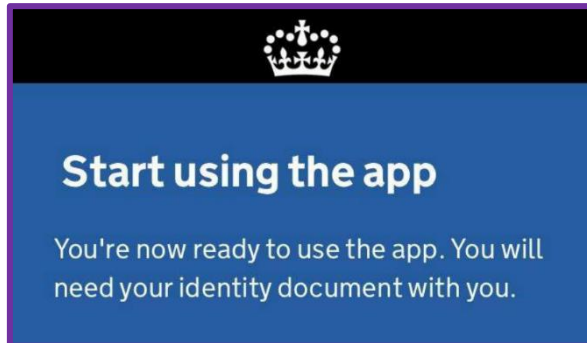

Once you have completed the steps above you will be able to see your application number. Once you click continue application you will be taken to the application navigation screen which shows each individual section of the online form. Before you can continue any further, you will need to confirm your identity using the 'UK Immigration: ID check' app.

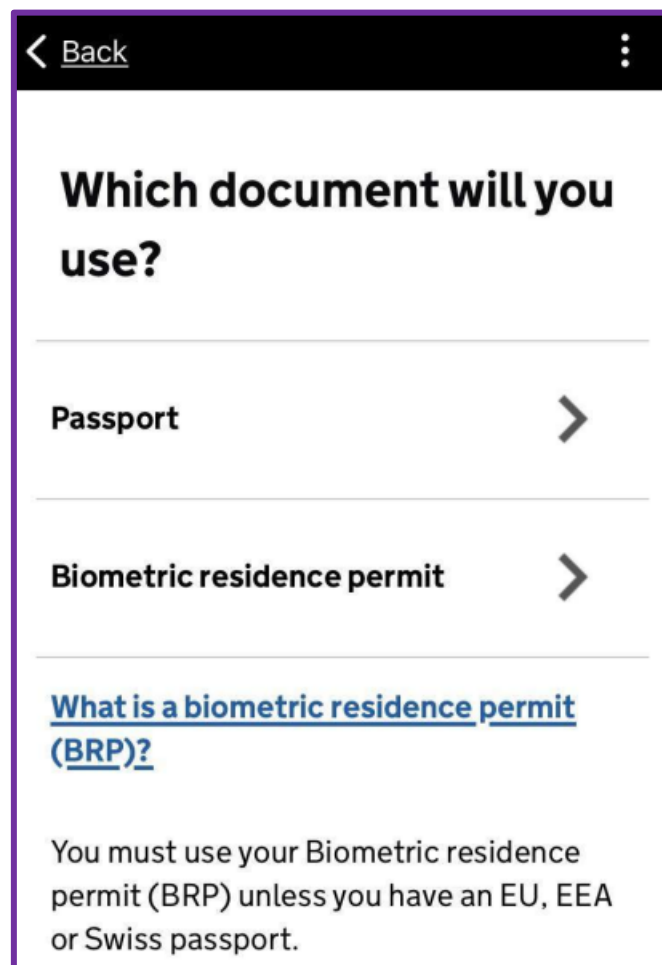
You should have this downloaded prior to continuing further. The application form will automatically open the app if it is installed on your device and you will need to complete the relevant steps before you can return to complete the rest of the application form.

Step Four: Confirming Your Identity

To use the app, you will first need to submit a 6-digit code which will be sent to the phone number you entered when setting up your account. You should then see the following on your screen.




You will then be asked to confirm which document you will be using to verify your identity. Currently, you can only use a BRP to complete this step unless you are an EU/EEA/Swiss national with a passport with a biometric chip (🇪🇺).



Step Five: Completing the Application Form

After successfully verifying your identity using the app, your application navigation screen should look like the image below once you have logged back into your account and clicked continue application.

You now start to complete the online application form proper, starting with immigration adviser details and working your way through each section until you have answered all the relevant questions. You should answer all questions honestly and to the best of your knowledge. Our guidance below should help you to provide the correct response to each question.

1. Identity and Contact

Immigration Adviser Details

Do you have an Immigration Adviser based in the UK?

This is referring to a solicitor or professional immigration adviser **only** and does not include staff from the **Student Immigration Team**. You should answer 'no' here unless a solicitor or agent is helping you to complete your application.

Contact Preferences

Contact Email

Confirm which email address can be used to contact you about your application.

Contact Phone Number

Provide a phone number you are happy to be used to contact you about your application. This would ideally be a UK contact number if you have one.

Address

Provide your current living address in the UK.

Other Names and Nationalities

If you have ever been known by any other name, then you should declare this and provide details.

The form will ask if you have a national identity card, which not all applicants will have as not all countries issue them. If you do have a national identity card, then you should answer **'yes'** to this question and provide the number and issuing authority. You should only be asked to upload evidence of your national identity card if you do not have a passport. If you do not have a national identity card, then you can just answer **'no.'**

If you have ever possessed any other nationality or citizenship, then you should declare this and provide details.

2. Prepare Application

People Applying with you

If you are applying with a partner or child as dependants then you need to answer **'yes'** here and provide their details.

Your Location

Where are you applying from?

You need to answer with United Kingdom here as you must be applying from **within the UK** to use this application form.

Personal Details

Biological Sex and Country of birth

Enter the details as shown in your passport.

Passport details

Use your passport to enter this information carefully and double check you have entered everything correctly before progressing. If you hold more than one passport, you must enter the details of the passport that matches your CAS and which you intend to use to enter the UK.

Do you live at this address? / Home address

If you have provided your home address previously then you can answer that you do live at the address. If you have provided an alternative address that you do not live at then you should answer **'no'** here and provide the details of your personal address in Manchester.

About your home

You will need to confirm whether you currently own or rent the property where you are currently living in the UK.

If you are renting your property, then you will also need to provide your landlord's information. If you do not rent or own where you live, then you will need to provide further information about your current living situation and who owns the property.

Previous address history (Last two years)

If you have lived at any other address in the last two years, either in the UK or overseas, then you should also provide these in the next section.

Family and Relationships

Relationship status

Confirm your current relationship status using the options provided.

Previous relationships

Confirm whether you have previously been in a marriage or civil partnership.

Give details about your parents

Enter the details your parents or step-parents. You will be asked to enter the details for each parent and it does not matter which one you enter first. If you do not have details for either then you can confirm that you cannot provide these details.

If you only have the details for one parent or step-parent then you can confirm you can only provide the details for one when asked about your other parent.

Travel History

How long have you lived in the UK

You need to answer how long you have been living in the UK for in total.

You should include the period for which you have had valid and continuous leave to remain (visa) in the UK. You do not need to exclude any short visits or travels outside the UK as you will include the details for some of this in the next section.

It should be noted that when an applicant is applying from within the UK for permission to stay and has been living in the UK with valid leave for 12 months or more on the date of application, they will meet the financial requirement and should not need to show evidence of their funds as part of their application.

Since you started living in the UK have you spent time outside the UK?

You should declare any travel you have made outside the UK longer than two weeks, including visits to your home country, since you started living in the UK. This may amount to a lot of trips for students who have been in the UK for several years who regularly return home during vacation periods. If you are struggling to remember the details of each individual visit then you should declare the trips you can recall and add a note to say that you have made several visits over the years to the same destination (home country).

Travel to Australia, Canada, New Zealand USA, the EU/EEA & Switzerland in the last 10 years

You should include the details of any trips you have made to these countries in the last 10 years. You should only need to include the details of your two most recent visits if you have had more than two in total in the last 10 years.

Travel to any other countries in the last 10 years.

If you have visited any other countries other than those included in the previous questions then you need to include these. You need to add each visit in turn and provide information to the best of your ability.

Medical treatment in the UK

You should answer 'yes' if you have received any medical treatment, including visits to a doctor's surgery (known as a General Practitioner or GP).

You need to include the address of where you were treated, the date and if you had to pay for the treatment. You should provide as much detail as you are able to and use Google to find address any details you are uncertain of. Please be aware that unpaid medical bills in the UK can lead to a visa refusal.

National insurance number and UK driving license number

You will only have a **National Insurance Number** if you have previously been employed in the UK or you have specifically applied for one whilst in the UK, for instance to look for a job. Similarly, you will only have a UK driving licence if you have previously applied for a licence so can answer no if you do not have one.

Public funds (money) in the UK?

This refers only to [specific welfare benefits](#). Student funding, such as scholarships and bursaries, **do not** count as public funds and student council tax exemptions also do not count as recourse to public funds.

Immigration Permission

Do you have a visa, leave to enter or remain or other permission to be in the UK?

Answer 'yes' here if you have a current valid visa to be in the UK. If you do not currently have a valid visa, for example because your visa has expired and you have overstayed in the UK, then you **must** contact us so that we can advise you.

What is your current visa?

You should enter the category of visa that you currently have. For most students this will be Student (General).

When did your current visa or leave to remain start?

You should enter the start date from your eVisa, or valid from date if you still have a physical visa.

Do you currently have an application with the Home Office for leave to remain for which you have not yet received a decision?

If you have submitted any other visa applications to UKVI which are still pending then you should declare them here and provide the relevant reference numbers. If you do not have any other active applications then you can answer 'no.'

Criminality

Immigration

It is very important that you confirm if you have ever had a visa application refused, been deported, removed or required to leave a country, or refused entry to a country.

The next question will also ask if you have ever entered the UK illegally, remained in the UK beyond your visa validity (overstaying), breached the conditions of your visa or provided false information when applying for a UK visa (deception).

If you answer 'yes' here you will need to provide more details, including a short explanation of what happened. If possible, it is best to include a reference number from any previous refusals or correspondence with UKVI in relation to any previous UK immigration issues.

Please contact us at visa@manchester.ac.uk if you are worried about your answers here.

Convictions and other penalties

You must declare any relevant convictions or penalties for the UK or from any other country regardless of when the offence occurred. This also includes cautions, warnings, civil court judgements and civil penalties.

If you select one of these then you must include further details. It is very important that you declare any such history to avoid any claim of deception in your visa application which could result in a refusal.

War crimes

You must read the information and guidance carefully before answering.

The application form includes definitions of any of the terms they use in these security questions if you are uncertain about any of them.

Terrorist activities, organisations and views

You must read the information and guidance carefully before answering.

Extremist organisations and views

You must read the information and guidance carefully before answering.

Person of good character

You must read the questions carefully before answering.

Previous employment

You must select any relevant work, whether it was paid or unpaid. For each one you need to write a brief explanation of the employer you worked for, what your role was, and the duration of employment. You can select more than one option here if you need to. If none of these apply to you then you can select 'I have not worked in any of the jobs listed above.'

Study Details

Do you have a Confirmation of Acceptance for Studies (CAS) number?

You must have received a CAS from the University before you can apply for a Student visa. You should answer 'yes' to this question and provide your CAS number if you have already received your CAS. If you are still waiting to receive your CAS to start a new course as an applicant then you should contact the admissions administrator for your Faculty, School, or Department. If you are a continuing student then you should contact your school or department's student support office and ask for a [Continuer CAS Request Form](#).

Course Dates

Course start date - Answer using the exact date as it is stated on your CAS.

Course end date - Answer using the exact date as it is stated on your CAS.

NOTE: You must answer with your **course start and end date** and not the issue and expiry date of your CAS or the original start date of your course if you are applying for a visa to extend your existing studies.

What type of sponsor will you be studying with?

The University of Manchester is a [Higher Education Provider with a track record of compliance](#) so select that option from the list.

Are you going to be a postgraduate doctor or dentist on a recognised Foundation Programme?

IMPORTANT: You need to ensure you answer 'no' to this question if asked. It is a common misunderstanding by applicants that they should answer yes to this question if they are studying for a PhD. However, this only applies to medical doctors and dentists sponsored by Health Education England.

UKVI will cancel applications which are found to have been submitted under the postgraduate doctor or dentist route in error and applicants will need to resubmit and pay for a new visa application.

UCAS

If you applied for your course through UCAS then you should answer 'yes' and include your UCAS number. If you did not apply for your course through UCAS then you should answer 'no.'

Academic Technology Approval Scheme (ATAS)

Not all students need an ATAS certificate to study their course – it is only required by some postgraduate level students who are studying certain science and technology subjects, including those undertaking integrated Masters courses such as MEng, MPhys, MSci etc.

Your CAS will state whether ATAS clearance is required for you to study your course. However, it is not necessary to wait for your CAS before you apply for ATAS, as long as you already have the necessary information from your School or Department, which should be included in your offer letter (CAH code and a list of taught modules or a research summary for postgraduate research students).

You don't need an ATAS certificate if you are a national of any of the exempt countries listed in the [ATAS Appendix](#) to the Immigration Rules.

If you do require an ATAS certificate, you must obtain it before you submit your visa application. During peak periods this can take 30 working days or more so it is best to apply as early as you can. Your ATAS certificate is valid for use in a visa application for up to 6 months and you will receive your certificate by email only.

Primary site of study

You should answer 'yes' to confirm that you will be studying at The University of Manchester's main campus. If you will be studying elsewhere for the main part of your course e.g. if you are on a joint course across two institutions or a split-site PhD student then you should include the address where you will be doing most of your studies.

Course information

Name of sponsor institution – Answer 'The University of Manchester'

Course name – Answer by copying the course title exactly as it appears on your CAS.

Qualification you will get – Select the option where the **RQF** section of the code matches the **NQF** level given for 'Course Level' on your CAS Statement.

- **'RQF5/ SCQF8'** for a foundation course
- **'RQF6/ SCQF9/10'** for an undergraduate course (bachelors)
- **'RQF7/ SCQF11'** for a postgraduate taught course (masters), integrated masters course (e.g. MEng or MPharm, MSci etc) or a postgraduate research masters (e.g. MPhil or MRes)
- **'RQF8/ SCQF12'** for a postgraduate research course (PhD)

Are you going to be a student union sabbatical officer?

A sabbatical officer is someone who has been elected to work for the Student's Union. Specific wording is added to a CAS where this is the case. You should answer 'no' if you are just applying to study a course.

Have you received money from a financial sponsor for either this current year or the past year?

You should answer 'yes' if you have received money from an official financial sponsor in the last 12 months. An official financial sponsor can be a University (Including The University of Manchester), the UK government, your home government, an international organisation (like a scholarship agency) or an international company (a company with offices in more than one country).

If in the last 12 months you have been in receipt of a sponsorship from a Government or International Scholarship Agency covering both fees and living costs for study in the UK then you will need to provide a letter from them which confirms their consent for you to remain in the UK to complete the course you are applying for a visa to study. If you are a continuing student who will continue to be sponsored by a Government or International Scholarship Agency for the remainder of your studies then this consent should be confirmed in the sponsor letter they have issued to you.

Will you get money from an official financial sponsor for your course?

Answer 'yes' if you are being sponsored by an official financial sponsor for the course for which you are applying or will continue to receive sponsorship for a course you are continuing.

Being **'wholly sponsored'** means that **both** your tuition fees and living expenses (maintenance) equal to at least **£1171 per month** are fully provided for by your financial sponsor.

If you are wholly sponsored by The University of Manchester this should be stated on your CAS and confirm that both your tuition fees and living expenses are covered. You should select **'My Student sponsor has confirmed this information on my CAS.'**

If you are wholly sponsored by a sponsor that is not The University of Manchester, then you must include a sponsor letter with your visa application to prove this and should choose **'Letter of official financial sponsorship.'**

If an official financial sponsor will not be providing funds to cover both your tuition fees and living costs **in full** then you should answer **'I am not being wholly sponsored.'**

What are your course fees for your first year?

Your tuition fee total will be confirmed on your CAS. Please note that 'first year' only applies to new starters. Continuing students should just enter the fee total for the current/next academic year as stated on the CAS.

Have you or your parent(s) or legal guardian(s) already paid any of your course fees?

Select 'yes' here if you have paid anything towards your fees and this is confirmed on your CAS. It can take 2 working days to receipt bank card payments and UK bank transfers and up to 10 working days for international bank transfers. So, it may take some time for your CAS to be updated depending on how the payment was made. If you have made a payment which is still not showing after the relevant period above then you can e-mail tuitionfees@manchester.ac.uk to query this.

Are any of the funds required for this application in the form of a student loan?

If you are relying on an educational loan as financial evidence, you should answer 'yes' here. You will be asked if you have already received your loan.

If you wish to use a loan letter as evidence of your funds for your visa application, the loan must be provided by either the relevant government, a government sponsored Student Loan Company or an academic or educational loans scheme. The loan letter must also meet certain requirements which are set out in our [financial guidance document](#).

Do you hold a Marshall, Chevening, or commonwealth scholarship?

If you are in receipt of financial sponsorship from any of the above then you should confirm this here.

English Language Ability

Do you have a medical condition that prevents you taking the English language test?

Your CAS should state how your English language has been assessed, so you can select 'NO' to this question.

Have you provided evidence of English language ability in a previous application?

You should answer yes here if you have submitted evidence of your English language in a previous successful visa application. If you have not done this, then you should select 'no' and proceed to the next question.

Has your sponsor assessed your English language ability?

If your CAS includes the statement **HEI sponsor assessment**, then this means that your English language proficiency has been assessed and you can answer 'yes.' If this is not the case, then you should answer 'no' to this and the following question until you are asked if your university has a **'track record of compliance'** and then you should select 'yes.'

Account Security Questions

You will be asked to select and provide answers for three security questions which UKVI will use to authorise sharing your application details if you contact them about your application once you have submitted it.

Declaration

You need to read the declaration and confirm that all the information you have provided in your application is true.


NOTE: You will no longer be able to edit your application form after completing the declaration and proceeding onto the payment of the Immigration Health Surcharge. If you are eligible to have your application checked by the Student Immigration Team, you should not proceed beyond this stage.

Step Six: Immigration Health Surcharge (IHS)

The Immigration Health Surcharge is a **compulsory charge** that must be paid to submit a Student visa application from within the UK.

The IHS is calculated at the rate of £776 per year and £388 for any period less than 6 months. Any period greater than 6 months will be rounded up to the yearly rate. **The calculation is based on the length of the visa you will be issued with and not just the length of your course so you may pay for periods you have already paid for if you are changing courses.** For more information about how the IHS is calculated please see our [webpage](#).

The IHS form will calculate how much you need to pay based on the information you have provided about your course.

Once you have successfully paid for the IHS, you will then need to click on the link as shown below to complete the payment of the Student visa application fee. If you have ever been known by any other name then you should declare this and provide details.

Once your payment goes through successfully, your application is considered to have been **submitted**. You will be directed to the following screen and formal confirmation of your payment will be sent to the email address you provided previously in the application form.

Important: You must send through clear evidence of your application payment confirmation to the Student Immigration Team to prove that your Right to Study continues while your application is in progress and so we can update your record to reflect this. You should email this evidence to visa@manchester.ac.uk with the subject title 'Visa Application Evidence – (ID Number).'

You should refer to the information on our [website](#) for guidance on what document you are required to upload as part of your application.

If you are applying for a visa to study at degree level or above, you should not need to provide evidence of your academic or English language qualifications. The Home Office now relies on Higher Education Providers like The University of Manchester to assess applicants' academic ability and language proficiency. This will be confirmed in the application, as shown below:

Your evidence

Study details evidence

Upload the evidence you gave to your sponsor to get your Certificate of Acceptance of Studies (CAS). For example, your qualifications or results transcript (including translations).

You do not need to upload this evidence if both of the following apply:

- you are studying at degree level
