I was also promoted to being a partner at the law firm, where we give civil legal advisory services to both government institutions and private institutions, especially investors who come to invest in Rwanda. HERE ARE A FEW HIGHLIGHTS FROM OUR HISTORY

1904

Catherine Chisholm becomes the first woman to graduate in Medicine from Manchester Medical School. She helped set up the Manchester Hospital for Babies.

1906

Christabel Pankhurst, who would become a leading figure in the suffragette movement, becomes the first woman to graduate from the university in Law.

1915

William Bragg, while still a research student, becomes the youngest ever winner of the Nobel Prize in Physics.

1917

Ernest Rutherford becomes the first person to create an artificial nuclear reaction in a laboratory, ushering in a new era of nuclear research.

1945

Ellen Wilkinson becomes Britain's first female Minister of Education. Born in Manchester, Ellen won a scholarship to study at the university and entered politics after graduating.

1948

Freddie Williams and **Tom Kilburn** successfully run a program on 'The Baby', the world's first digital stored-program computer.

1948

Alan Turing, one of the WWII codebreakers, completes pioneering work in machine intelligence at Manchester, paving the way for artificial intelligence.

1957

Bernard Lovell completes the Lovell Telescope, the world's largest steerable radio telescope at the time, at Jodrell Bank.

1974

Jean McFarlane* is appointed as the first Professor of Nursing in the UK by the university and goes on to establish the country's first nursing degree.

1979

Arthur Lewis, Britain's first black professor, becomes the first black winner of a Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences.**

1993

Michael Smith, a Manchester PhD graduate, receives the Nobel Prize in Chemistry for his work on DNA engineering.

2010

Manchester alumna **Dame Sally Davis** is appointed as the UK's first female Chief Medical Officer.

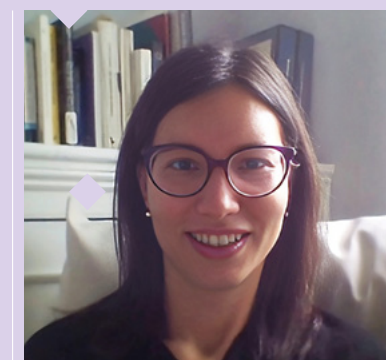
Manchester has a variety of outstanding Criminology experts who advise and assist our students' academic progress.

PROFESSOR DAVID GADD

Professor in Criminology

David Gadd completed his MPhil at Cambridge University and his PhD from Keele University. He is best known for his narrative studies of offenders, including his research on domestic abuse perpetrators, hate crime perpetrators and people traffickers. David teaches crime theory in the criminology programmes. His work is characterized by a distinctively psychosocial approach to criminology that explores the dynamics between the subjective worlds of people who have sometimes committed serious crimes and the social and cultural aspects of their lives.

"I have long been interested in the question of why some people perpetrate abuses that many of us would regard as unthinkable, and think it is critical that criminologists and their students are equipped with the skills needed to engage with the discourses of blame that discourage attempts at understanding within the criminal justice system."



PROF JULIA BUXTON

British Academy Global Professor

Julia is British Academy Global Professor, with a four-year award for research on changing patterns of drug supply and the impact of decriminalisation and legalisation initiatives on the quality of drug policy making, stakeholder inclusion and reduction of drug related harms.

"I came to drug policy research through disparate personal, academic and research experiences. Observable negative outcomes ranging from lack of access to medical morphine in palliative care, displacement of Colombian refugees in Venezuela, and violence in the areas of Manchester and London where I had lived or was living all configured around the criminalisation and policing of drugs and drug 'wars'."

DR OLGA SANCHEZ DE RIBERA

Lecturer in Criminology

Olga, a PhD holder from the Institute of Criminology (University of Cambridge), joined the University in 2021. She previously worked as a postdoc at the Universidad de la Republica (Uruguay) and as a consultant for the InterAmerican Development Bank (IDB). Her research interests include neurocriminology, program evaluation, risk assessment, systematic reviews, and violent offenders.

"I teach a new course on prisons, providing critical knowledge of empirical and policy discussions about prisons and rehabilitation programs. The course takes a multidisciplinary approach, offering weekly workshops on research, policy, and practice."

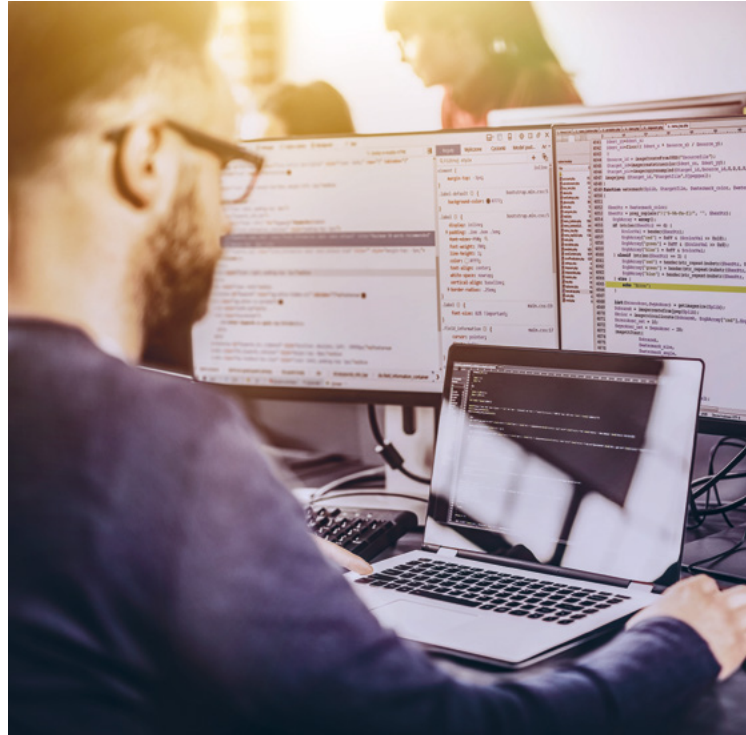

Our MA in Economics combines rigorous training in microeconomic and macroeconomic principles, quantitative methods and applied economics. Graduates leave with a firm grasp on economic concepts and techniques as well as an advanced understanding of how applied and policy-oriented research has relevance for real-world economists.

This course develops the key skills necessary for an economist working at public or private organisations, including inquiry, critical analysis, logical thinking and the application of theory to solve practical problems. Financial Economics MSc

12 MONTHS FULL-TIME

The demand for highly skilled experts in finance and financial economics continues to increase rapidly in the modern economy. This demand exists in the public sector (e.g. central banks and international organisations) and especially in the private sector (e.g. commercial banks and investment companies).

This course is designed for those who wish to pursue a future career in the realms of financial economics and finance. It combines an introduction to fundamental principles of investment science and training in the mathematical methods needed for the analysis of financial markets. The programme will expose students to quantitative techniques and theory that will be useful to any actor in the financial industry: a portfolio manager, a risk management consultant, or a financial analyst.

Professor Igor Evstigneev
MSc Financial Economics Programme Director

"Financial Economics is a fascinating area, having a history marked by outstanding achievements. A remarkable feature of this discipline is that its theoretical highlights (such as the Black-Scholes formula) turned out to be extremely important in practice. They created new markets essentially based on concepts suggested by academics. Nowadays the turnovers of these new markets, especially markets for derivative securities, are measured in billions. This is perhaps the only example in the history of Economics when principles that have led to the emergence of a new economic reality were discovered by mathematicians – 'on the tip of the pen'. The course will offer you an unforgettable tour through the beautiful land of Financial Economics guided by world-leading experts in the field."

You will study a wide variety of ethical and legal subjects in both a domestic and global context, including autonomy, consent, refusal of treatment, mental capacity, confidentiality, the moral status of the foetus, resource allocation, genetic testing, genome sequencing, clinical negligence, organ and tissue transplantation, fertility treatment, genetic manipulation, research ethics, disability screening, euthanasia and end of life care.

Our ResLife advisers are on hand in every hall, providing the help you need to settle into your new community, and they will

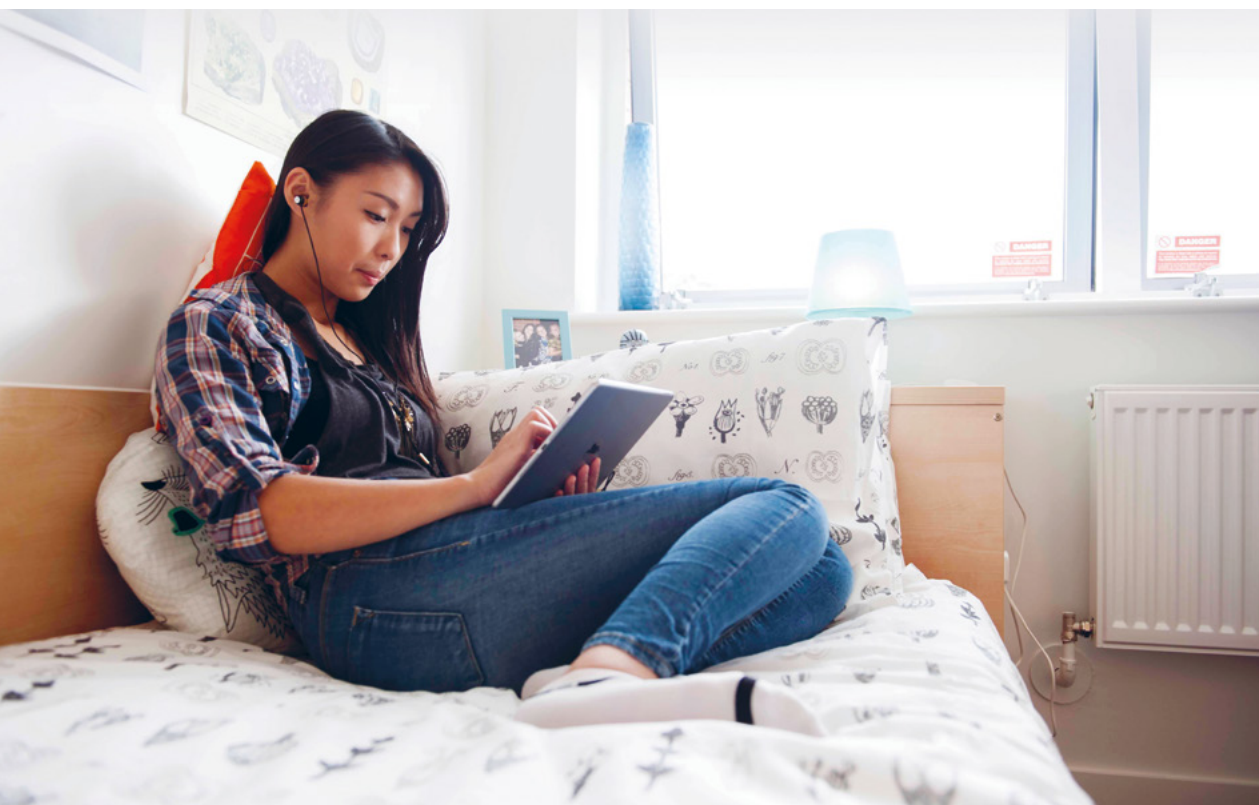
continue to look out for your wellbeing throughout your time living with us.

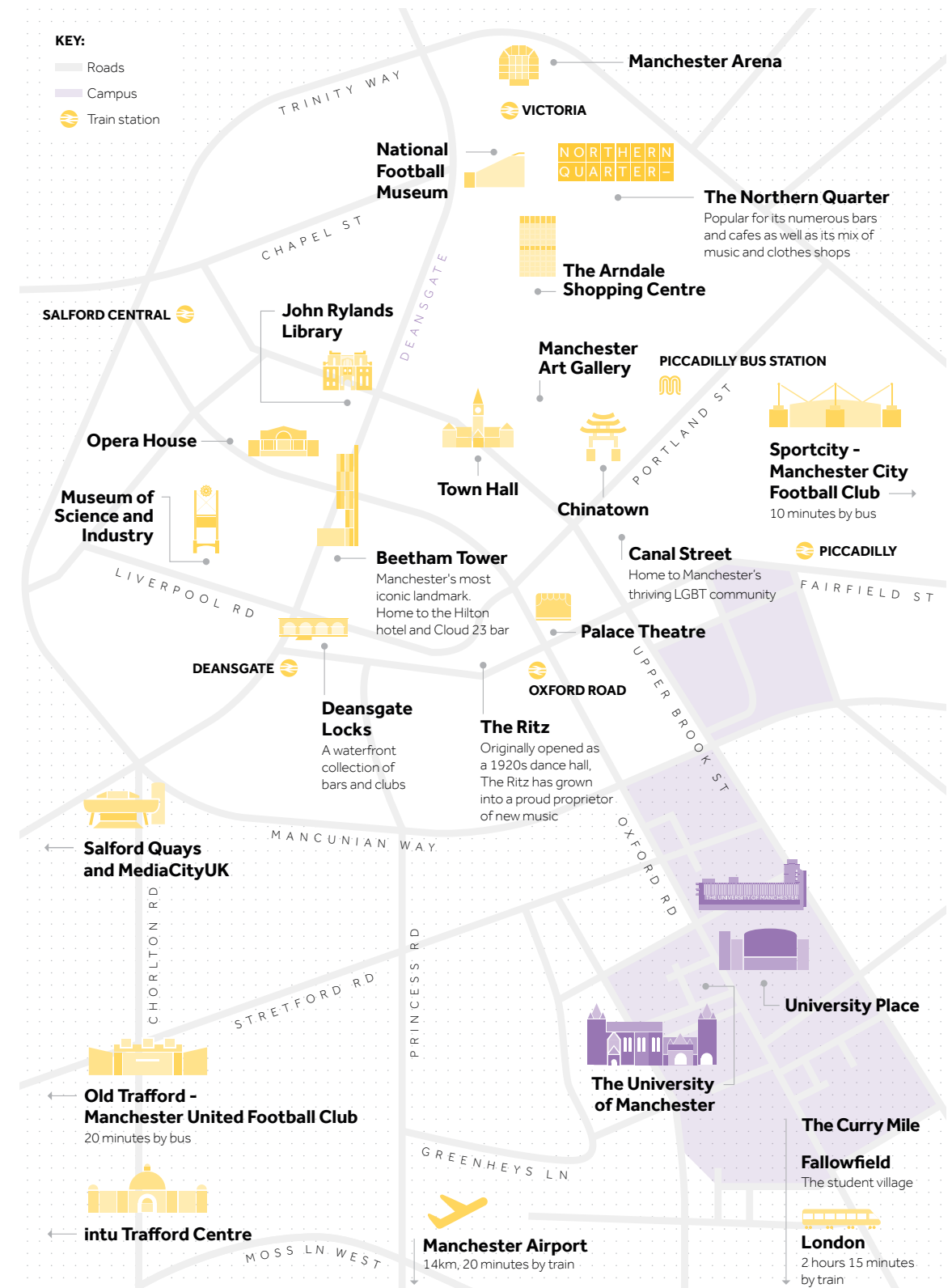
