	al Health NHS Foundation Trust (GMMH) delivers mental health & dementia ople across the age spectrum. Research is a core Trust activity.	
The Culturally-adapted Family Intervention (CaFI) trial is hosted by GMMH. CaFI is a multi-site		
Randomised Controlled Trial (RCT) of a bespoke psychological therapy co-designed with people Sub-		
Saharan African and Caribbean service users diagnosed with schizophrenia spectrum disorders and their		
families.		
People of African-Caribbean origin, including those of 'Mixed' heritage, are more likely to be diagnosed		
with schizophrenia than o	ther ethnic groups in the UK. They are also less likely to	
be offered psychological t	herapy. National Institute for Health and Care Excellence (NICE)	
highlight a need for cultur	ally-appropriate/informed psychosocial interventions to address inequalities in	
access, care, and outcomes experienced by people from these backgrounds.		
The RCT will investigate the clinical and cost-effectiveness of CaFI compared to usual care. The study will		
also aim to find out what will make it easier/harder for CaFI to be implemented in services and to		
understand whether anything can be done differently to enable delivery of CaFI in various parts of the		
country. This process evaluation will investigate the delivery of the CaFI intervention qualitatively and		
quantitatively across all pa	articipating sites.	
The study append to recruitment in December 2021 and will remain open to recruitment until April 2024		
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In addition to Greater Manchester, the study is taking place in the Midlands, London, and South West of England.		
The Honorary Research As	ssistant (RA) will support the delivery of CaFI at GMMH.	
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Professor Edge is also leading establishment of a specialist Equality, Diversity & Inclusion (EDI) Research		
Unit within GMMH.
