What are we doing?

We are establishing a **real-time data collection** of suspected suicide deaths by **in-patients** and patients who died **within 14 days of discharge**

We will monitor **numbers** and **rates** of suicide and examine **changes** in the characteristics of patients closest to care






<u>Why are we doing this?</u>

Real-time surveillance systems of suspected suicide can help with **early detection** and therefore **timely actions**

It will allow us to ask for information that we **need to know early** to support suicide prevention efforts such as emerging, novel methods and possible clusters

This will also support **national learning** to **prevent future deaths**
