Project Outline

IPPR currently has a programme of work to develop a green industrial strategy for the UK. This broadly involves setting out the supply-side and demand-side policy reforms, shifts in economic conditions, and regulatory environment needed to deliver the UK's net zero targets in a way that also delivers economic growth. This framework will be applied to a range of different sectors including transport, the power sector, energy intensive industries and heating.

Examples of topics may include:

- Quantitative analysis demonstrating economic benefits of investment
- Quantitative analysis of potential growth of green manufacturing sectors in the UK
- Literature reviews of discreet topic areas (e.g. electric vehicle charging infrastructure across the UK)
- Support with stakeholder interviews and roundtables

Ideation of policy recommendations across a range of sectors needing to decarbonise using the green industrial strategy framework.
