Application Criteria

Essential:

- Understanding of statistics, analysis and use of data
- Positive attitude, strong work ethic, and ability and willingness to learn quickly
- Knowledge of Microsoft Office, especially Excel, Outlook and Word
- Excellent spoken and written English

Desirable:

- Some knowledge of crime and policing issues
- Working knowledge of Tableau or QGIS
- Understanding of data analytics and visualisation techniques

Project Outline

Sitting within the wider GMCA research team, students will focus on projects relating to policing and crime in Greater Manchester. Students will undertake desk-based analysis of local, national and regional datasets to inform delivery of the local Police and Crime Plan.

Specifically, we are looking for support with an interim evaluation of the Navigator programme, with a focus on the community navigator element of this programme. This programme was launched in May 2021 by Greater Manchester's Violence Reduction Unit. The programme works with young people aged 10-25, who are involved with or at risk of serious violence. So far, the programme has reached almost 1,000 young people and we would like your support in evaluating this programme so far.
