DEGREE APPRENTICESHIPS

January Ofsted Visit

On Friday 26 January, AMBS received a call from Ofsted, announcing a four-day visit the following week (30 Jan to 2 February). Three inspectors came and spoke to staff involved in the delivery of the two apprenticeship programmes as well as senior staff from the School, Faculty and University.

It was an intense visit for all involved. The official report is now publicly available so the results can be known. The outcome was very positive, with a 'Good' in all areas (including 'Overall effectiveness' and 'The quality of education'). Ofsted allow to have a second person in all the meetings as a 'shadow nominee' and Janine Holdway took up this role, shadowing Ania de Berg, Director of Apprenticeships in AMBS.


Whilst apprenticeships currently only sit within AMBS, the University has plans to extend this provision.
