In this role you will access and analyse data on a range of issues relating to poverty at a local authority and neighbourhood level, supporting GMPA to create a free data resource that will be accessed by thousands of organisations, researchers and residents across the North West of England to support with efforts to tackle poverty.

Your analysis will involve looking at labour market, health, education, income and social security data, creating an in-depth picture of poverty in localities across the North West.

You'll have a strong attention to detail, excellent analytical skills, and a passion for using data to achieve change.
