

# Humanities Strategic Civic Engagement Fund (HSCEF)

## Spring 2024 Call

The Faculty of Humanities welcomes funding applications which support our Social Responsibility and Civic Engagement strategy. This reflects how our work is enhanced and inspired by our location in Greater Manchester and the way we improve lives and communities across our city region. Priority will be given to projects with a 'civic' and GM focus. Applications to this fund should be developed collaboratively with local partners and informed by the needs of local communities.

### Focus of award:

Projects should demonstrate a clear commitment to supporting the [University's](#) and [Faculty's](#) Civic Engagement strategy with clear impact on partners, communities and people within Greater Manchester. It is the expectation that applications to this fund will foster collaboration, with local communities, third sector organisations, businesses or government organisations. Priority will be given to projects that demonstrate an ambition to:

- Co-create research funding applications with local stakeholders,
- Deploy our teaching expertise to the benefit of the local community,
- Articulate new ways of engaging people in Greater Manchester that contribute to the University's standing as a world-leading innovator.

In line with the University's vision for social responsibility, the Faculty of Humanities encourages applications in the following areas:

- Social inclusion
- Prosperous communities
- **Environmental sustainability\***
- Cultural engagement
- Better health

*\*Further to this, to support the Faculty's Environmental Sustainability strategy we aim to fund at least one project focused on this area.*

The fund is particularly keen to encourage applications that involve cross- departmental or school collaboration within the Faculty. Collaborative projects with other Faculties and applications that have received or aspire to apply for additional funding to University or external sources are also welcomed.

Applications should demonstrate the strategic importance of their partnership, their expected outcomes and impact as well as their potential for creating sustainable benefits beyond the funding cycle.

### Conditions of award:

- Applicants must have approval from their respective Head of School or Director of Social Responsibility.
- Funding is available to all academic, research and professional services staff within the Faculty of Humanities.
- A maximum of £10,000 will be awarded for individual projects.
- Funds must be spent between 1 August 2024 and 31 July 2025.
- Expenses for non-University staff may be covered, but staff time may not be.
- This fund is not designed to support attendance of conferences.
- The award holder must be employed as a member of staff for the duration of the project.
- An outcome and impact report will be requested upon completion of the project.
- Applicants will be responsible for managing the project themselves and funding will be directly transferred into their local finance code and it is their responsibility to oversee and manage spending.

Awards will be announced by **early June**. Funds must be spent between 1 August 2024 and 31 July 2025.
