Please note:

When choosing the course units you wish to take, full time students must ensure they choose 180 credits. Part-time students must take 60 credits in their first year, and 120 credits in their second year (including the dissertation). The order in which the modules will be taken by part-time students will need to be agreed with the programme director, just the same as with full-time students.

Students with sufficient prior background in **statistics (*)** (e.g. UG training in fitting and interpreting general and generalized linear models using R) need not take LELA60141 Foundational Statistics in R and can take an optional course unit in Sem 1 instead. The recommended option for Sem 1 is LELA62021 Semantics and Pragmatics which is designed as an introductory module.

Students with sufficient prior background in **linguistics (*)** (e.g. UG degree in Linguistics / English Language; introduction to Linguistics as part of a degree in a Modern Language) need not take LELA60122 Describing Language and can take any optional course unit offered in Sem 2 instead.

Students with sufficient prior background in **both (*)** linguistics and statistics need not take either LELA60141 Foundational Statistics in R or LELA60122 Describing Language and will thus take 5 core units and 3 optional units within the taught component of the programme.

Where appropriate to their development as a computational linguist, with permission of the programme director and if the timetable allows, students will be able to use any credits remaining after fulfilling the mandatory requirements to take other modules from our MA Linguistics programme. For example, a student wishing to focus their research on computational syntax might request to take an advanced syntax module.

(*) This will be decided by the programme director following an initial meeting with the student.

Helpful hints

The semester a course is taught in is identified by the last digit in the course code. A zero identifies the course unit is taught over both semesters.
