Amongst other things it provides:

- a Tech Playground designed to be a safe space to test out new software and equipment;
- a well-equipped Hyflex blended learning classroom, a Virtual Reality classroom;
- · a flexible video recording studio and associated green room;
- as well as a selection of individual and group podcasting suites.

All this, alongside two lecture theatres and some well-placed, drop-down study spaces. The facilities are being made available for booking via the central system, though some facilities may require some induction in advance. I am sure some of you will want to jump at the opportunity to test them out!

Looking ahead, <u>Together24</u> is very much on the horizon and the agenda has now been published, along with the Rylands award nominations. It looks amazing, so I hope you are all looking forward to the day as much as I am. Supporting our Departments with professional accreditation audits

Part of the work of the Engagement Librarians is to support Departments with their accreditation audits, to ensure our academic programmes are working to the highest internationally recognised standards and providing our graduates with a pathway to professional chartership.

lan Fishwick and I recently supported the Department of Chemical Engineering with their Institution of Chemical Engineers (IChemE) accreditation visit. Since the previous accreditation, over £450 million has been invested in providing students with access to an extensive range of advanced and innovative teaching and laboratory spaces through the creation of the home of Engineering and Materials, (formerly Manchester Engineering Campus Development), and in new and flexible laboratory space for undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in the James Chadwick Building.

As part of the audit process, the Engagement Librarians had to demonstrate to assessors how the Library is dedicated to fully supporting the effective delivery of the Chemical Engineering programmes. This is achieved through the provision of extensive <u>subject specialist resources</u> and through the development of our student's academic and professional skills, commencing with the foundational 'Get Started' programme and extending to the award-winning 'My Learning Essentials' (MLE) resources.





The assessors were particularly interested in how the Library assists students in developing essential skills such as group work, presenting, and report writing. We outlined how we respond to specific teaching/learning requests from Departments and, through active consultation with academics and Library colleagues and our wider knowledge of Faculty concerns, we create new or improved resources which are relevant across a Faculty. The MLE online resources supporting 'Group Work' and 'Report Writing' are both examples of this engagement and collaboration between the Library and academics.
