A Conference in Honour of W. Arthur Lewis 14-15 November 2024

at The Arthur Lewis Lab for Comparative Development at The University of Manchester

Seventy years ago in 1954, W. Arthur Lewis published the pioneering article Economic development with unlimited supplies of labour in the <u>Manchester School</u>. It was a <u>foundational scholarly piece for the field of development economics</u>, in particular structural change; see also <u>this biography</u>. He was awarded the Nobel Prize in Economics in 1979.

Keynote speakers are Gérard Roland (University of California, Berkeley and CEPR) and Richard Rogerson (Princeton University).

We now invite submissions from interested researchers on topic within structural change, economic growth and macro development, and economic history of development. Only full-length papers will be considered.

The submission deadline is Tuesday, 27 August 2024 at 5PM (BST).
