416 students completed the Stellify Award this year, which includes a total of 36.387 volunteering hours and 1,426 leadership roles - all with the aim of making a difference.














University lights up for 200th celebration

We 'painted the town purple' in January - creating a pathway of light illuminating Oxford Road to mark the start of our 200th anniversary celebrations.

Light Up was the first in a series of exciting bicentenary events to take place throughout 2024, and saw campus transformed from frosty white to the University's signature purple.





Manchester wins top prize at Green Gown Awards

The University won the 2030 Climate Action prize at the prestigious UK and Ireland Green Gown Awards in recognition of our "forward looking and innovative" work to decarbonise our campus operations.

University remains UK number 1 for social and environmental impact

Manchester was named top in both the UK and Europe, and second in the world, for meaningful contributions towards the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals in the 2024 *Times* Higher Education (THE) University Impact Rankings.

Our University is the only institution in the world to rank in the top ten for social and environmental impact in every year of the THE Impact Rankings.

University launches new scholarship in memory of Laura Nuttall



Manchester's School of Social Sciences has launched a new scholarship in memory of Politics, Philosophy and Economics graduate Laura Nuttall, who passed away in May 2023 after a long battle against cancer.

Claire Fox, the School's Director of Equality, Diversity and Inclusion, said the scholarship was a "fitting tribute" to Laura, who worked hard to raise awareness and funds for brain cancer charities.

100k-panel solar farm to power **University**

The University has signed a landmark deal that will see up to 65% of our electricity supplied through a new renewables project.

In a major move towards achieving our zero carbon ambition by 2038, we've partnered with leading UK clean energy company Enviromena to buy electricity generated from its brand new solar farm, based in Medebridge, Essex – which is as large as around 70 football pitches.



Manchester poet wins prestigious TS Eliot Prize

Jason Allen-Paisant was named the winner of the UK's most prestigious poetry award, the TS Eliot Prize.

Jason, who is a Senior Lecturer in Critical Theory and Creative Writing at our Centre for New Writing, was honoured for his collection Self-Portrait As Othello, which explores Black masculinity and immigrant identity.



New bursary for care leavers

A generous gift of £1.5m from British businessman and Manchester alumnus Simon Sadler enabled us to launch a new bursary for students who are leaving care.

Simon grew up in Blackpool, and was the first in his family to attend University. He is currently Chief Investment Officer of Segantii Capital Management, which he founded in 2007, and the owner and chairman of his hometown football club Blackpool FC.

Throughout our 200-year history, Manchester has helped shape the world through knowledge, wisdom and humanity.

1874

Edward Ryley Langworthy

The Langworthy Chair, a position later held by five Nobel Prize laureates, is created by the legacy of this donor to the University.



1906

Dame Christabel Pankhurst DBE

Prior to her role in the suffragette movement, she graduates in law at a time when it was illegal for women to practise the profession.



1948

Sir Ernest Rutherford OM FRS

This pioneer of chemistry and physics, who would later 'split' the atom becomes the University's first Nobel Prize winner in 1908.





1945

Ellen Wilkinson

Ellen Wilkinson is appointed as Britain's first female minister for education. As a student she won scholarships for every stage of her education.



Prof Alan Turing OBE FRS

The famed wartime codebreaker joins the University, where he later gains a reputation as the father of modern computing.





1979

Sir Arthur Lewis

Britain's first Black professor, Arthur Lewis wins the 1979 Nobel Prize for Economics.



1998

Prof Brian Cox OBE FRS

Graduating in Physics, Brian Cox starts a scientific career that has seen him become a household name through his work to popularise science.

Prof Danielle George MBE

Danielle George is awarded her PhD.

Ten years later she receives an MBE

for her services to promote public

engagement in engineering.



2004

Prof Alan Gilbert AO

Alan Gilbert is appointed President and Vice-Chancellor in 2004, later establishing Equity and Merit Scholarships and the Manchester Access Programme.

Naa Acquah is named General Secretary of the Students' Union - the first Black woman to hold the position.



The gowns worn for traditional graduation ceremonies originated in the 12th century as medieval scholars' garments. It's speculated that these long gowns were donned to keep scholars warm in drafty buildings and symbolize their status at the same time.
