POLICY UPDATES

NEW Student Pregancy, Maternity and New Parent Policy Approved by Senate

A new <u>Student Pregnancy</u>, <u>Maternity and New Parent Policy</u>, as well as accompanying <u>procedures</u>, has been approved by Senate. This new policy will allow students who are pregnant, or about to become new parents, to follow these new, specific arrangements rather than using the Policy on Interruptions.

The policy also outlines the support available for students who are new parents, including maternity, adoptions and paternity (or secondary carer/partner) arrangements and applies to all registered Undergraduate and Postgraduate Taught Students across the University.

Annual Policy Review Cycle

TAUGHT PROGRAMME ENHANCEMENT (QUALITY FRAMEWORK, STUDENT VOICE DATA, AND POLICY)

National Student Survey (NSS) Results

The National Student Survey for 2024 was published on Wednesday 10th July. We had another high response rate this year with 72.5%. This is evident of a great level of engagement from our students, providing us with the opportunity to learn and develop for future cohorts.

This is the second year using the new survey methodology which no longer has a question on overall satisfaction (see StaffNet article on <u>NSS 2024 - Fives things to know</u> for further details). As there is no recognised summary metric in use in the sector, we are monitoring overall positivity across all questions, which is the proportion of respondents choosing the two most positive choices (compared to all respondents excluding those who respond "This does not apply to me"). The overall positivity rate for Manchester this year was 75%, the same as 2023 and 4.2% behind the operational priority target for this year. Across the sector there were improvements in student satisfaction so the University benchmark for 2024 increased to 79.9%

SCHEDULING (TIMETABLING, EXAMINATIONS, AND PROGRESSION & ASSESSMENT)

Engagement Analytics (EA) Update

Mohamad Atiq started his role as the Engagement Analytics Officer on 24th June and has been meeting with the Visa check-in/Attendance Monitoring Team. This team comprises of 3 team leaders and 10 support staff, working across the campus providing a 'check-in' service to those students who are required to confirm attendance. In addition, Atiq is working with the EA Project team who are tasked with the implementation of the new Engagement Analytics solution software (SEAtS) for September 2024. The project is progressing apace, with testing of the new system due to commence in July 2024.

Timetabling

Personal academic timetables for 2024-25 were released to staff on Friday 12th July. An incredible effort by the teams to create schedules for just over 3,000 academic staff and around 37,000 taught activities. Next up is a three-week window to make essential adjustments before timetables are released to students in August, as they select their course unit options for next year. Syllabus+ aligns, Timetables weave through their dance, Pathways shift and sway.

Examinations

Preparation has begun for the August re-sit period. Following student results, data is captured for those requiring a resit along with the component requirements that are to be re-assessed. Invigilators are also providing their availability, which should provide adequate cover for the two-week assessment window. Timetables will be released to students early in August.
