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CREATIVITY IN Manchester

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Tuesday 30th July, London, UK – <u>Youth Music</u>, the UK's leading young people's music charity, has today announced the recipients of its unique £1.5million Energiser Fund, dedicated to pre-school creativity.

The fund, open to early years experts, leaders and innovators, will allow the selected organisations to accelerate change in their early years practice.

Youth Music believe that babies and toddlers are skilled and creative individuals, and should have the opportunity to influence the organisations and activities they are involved in. However, the early years sector is in crisis and funding is more important than ever. Practitioners are reporting an increase in number of settings closing down, staff shortages and ongoing retention issues, as well as the de-prioritisation of creative education when it comes to policy and resource allocation.

As a result of this, **The Whitworth** will work with Youth Music and the ten other partners nationwide to revolutionise early years creativity. The projects will benefit from a three-year grant to deliver creative programmes with 2-4-year-olds. Organisations will come together to network and reflect throughout the three years, in a bespoke learning programme.

Support from the Energiser Fund will allow the Whitworth to explore how playful interventions and creative sessions in gallery spaces can enhance and celebrate the 2–4-year old's voice. We are excited to partner with local community led charity Afrocats, to co-create sessions with families who often face barriers to accessing traditional early years provision.

As part of The University of Manchester research is integral to our project, working with colleagues at LuCiD (The ESRC International Centre for Language and Communicative Development) staff and volunteers will be trained to embed language and communication learning into creative sessions and ongoing evaluation.

Ed Watts, Head of Civic Engagement and Education at the Whitworth said: "We're delighted to be part of the Energiser Fund and have the opportunity to work with Youth Music and other incredible partners, to build on our brilliant early years work here at the Whitworth. Together with local families, using our gallery and park as a space to share ideas to bring art into everyday life and rethink how we use it.

We're excited to continue to collaborate with Afrocats in bringing 2–4-year-olds together through music, performance, and art. We hope to dismantle barriers to early years learning, and language development, in our community and to make a difference to families across greater Manchester and beyond!"

Matt Griffiths, Youth Music CEO, said: "Investing in Early Years is a matter of equity and inclusion, and with reports from early years practitioners that the suggested measures from the government feeling inadequate, it's clear that work needs to be done to support the creativity in this age group.

"We're really excited by the progressive work happening at these projects already and can't wait to work with them to change the creative landscape for early years children nationwide over the coming years."
