HOW TO APPLY





1. BEFORE YOU APPLY

- Think about what attracts you to working in healthcare.
- Consider your potential working environment and the type of patient, place and work you think you'd enjoy.
- Do some research into medicine and dentistry and what courses are available, then check if the required entry grades look realistically achievable.
- We accept a range of qualifications from around the world. If you are unsure if your academic profile meets the entry requirements then you can contact ug.medicine@manchester.ac.uk

2. SUMMER BEFORE YOU SUBMIT YOUR UCAS APPLICATION (JUNE-SEPTEMBER)

Before you apply, you will need to take the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT). The UCAT is a computer-based test, delivered in Pearson VUE test centres throughout the UK and worldwide. This will test your cognitive abilities, attitudes and professional behaviours appropriate for an aspiring healthcare professional. Your test results will be sent automatically to us around early November, at which point we will set our UCAT threshold for that application cycle. Applicants must meet the threshold to be considered for interview.

The UCAT result is valid only for the year in which you apply (either for direct or deferred entry). If you are making a second application, you must retake the UCAT.



4 + 1. You can apply for a maximum of four medicine or dentistry courses. Your fifth choice has to be a different discipline (for example biology).

(SEPTEMBER-OCTOBER)

- In your application tell us about your current qualifications and how you match up to our entry criteria. Include all qualifications, pending as well as unsuccessful. Please check you have input your qualifications correctly. If you meet the minimum academic requirements, you will progress to the next stage of the selection process.
- Your personal statement can include your reasons for choosing/changing to medicine or dentistry, details about your work experience in a caring role and your knowledge/experience of the UK healthcare system. You can also include your interests/hobbies, team working ability, communication skills, determination, conscientiousness and intellectual potential.
- Your references should be written by people who can comment about you as a person, as well as your academic achievements and potential. This could be a teacher or an academic supervisor.











When your place is confirmed by the University, you can formally register as a student and start the course in Welcome Week, which is usually the beginning of the first term in September.

7. YOUR FIRM AND INSURANCE CHOICE

You will have until the UCAS reply deadline to make your decisions on which course you choose as your firm or insurance choice.

Once all of your conditions have been met, your offer will then be updated to unconditional firm or unconditional insurance. For offer holders who are awaiting academic results, these must be met by A-level results day in August.

6. OFFER OF A PLACE (MARCH-MAY)

If you are successful at interview, you will receive a conditional offer. All offers are conditional upon meeting specific non-academic conditions (as well as academic conditions where appropriate). These conditions will be stated in your offer.



4. DENTISTRY ONLY: NON-ACADEMIC APPLICATION FORM

If you're applying for dentistry, after we receive your application, we'll ask you directly for more in-depth information about your work experience, hobbies, teamwork and motivation to study dentistry. We'll also ask about why you are applying to Manchester specifically.









MMI is a formal but friendly process and the majority of the interviewers have university and clinical backgrounds. The aim is to determine if you satisfy our non-academic criteria in terms of the values and behaviours expected of a medical/dental student. We will assess your ability to communicate, why you want to be a doctor or dentist, your previous caring experience, matters of a medical/dental interest, and ethical issues. Students who live outside the UK will be offered the option of an interview in person in Manchester, or online via Zoom. The format and assessment criteria are the same for both options.
