TAUGHT PROGRAMME ENHANCEMENT

PGT Dissertation Survey

Preparations are underway for the 2023/24 PGT Dissertation Survey. Colleagues in Schools have been asked to check student enrolments on relevant units using the new Digital Integration Gateway (DIG) tool. Colleagues have until Friday 20th September to complete this part of the process, after which the team will finalise the date and prepare surveys deployment on 30th September.

DIG is a dynamic tool that helps to increase the accuracy of our data and support automation of the data review, survey and evaluation tasks for which the data will be used. In the future we aim to distribute the responsibility to review this data to a wider number of appropriate colleagues in each school, reducing the burden on one colleague/a small team centrally.
