Differ from research-based PhD programmes (emphasis on taught and practical elements aimed at developing skills in psychological practice)


Health and Care Professions Council (HCPC) and British Psychological Society (BPS) accreditation (robust FTP processes)

Significant cohort sizes (24 and 12)

1/3 of all PGR students in MIE

Shared activities (Induction, SEED Conference, wellbeing focused events, cross discipline working and integrating into the wider PGR community).

Both programmes have a commitment to challenging oppression, discrimination and inequalities (research and practice)



Commitment to social responsibility

DEdPsych – Placements in schools; local authorities

DCounsPsych - 450 hours of therapy delivered in a variety of settings, primarily on a voluntary basis

- NHS placements in a range of settings (specialist and general physical and/or mental health)
- Third sector organisations (e.g. for rape victims/survivors, asylum seekers)
- Educational settings (e.g. UoM wellbeing service)
- Forensic settings (e.g. police services, prisons)

Building a research community (based on MIE/SEED's shared commitment to social responsibility)



Collaboration based on topics and methodologies; Cross discipline work encouraged (emphasis on working with and for minoritized individuals and communities; social justice agenda's central to practice and research)



Promoting the value of research-based practice and practice-based research



Emphasis on social Impact; projects relate directly to MIE research groups (on both professional doctorates)



Publishing (systematic reviews); dissemination via other routes

Cross discipline networking
