

Global Futures Scholarships

In recent years the University has expanded its scholarship offer for international students. Our main scheme is called the Global Futures Scholarship and is worth £8000 per year for up to three years of study for students who meet the eligibility criteria. The criteria include:

1. Must be paying the overseas tuition fee
2. Must be studying or have already completed their **A Level, IB or Standard XII studies**
3. Must be domiciled in an eligible country, including Indonesia
4. Must be studying a course other than Medicine, Dentistry or Architecture.
5. Not applicable for students entering at foundation year.

Course and Application Updates

UoM already offers more than 300+ degree options but have recently refreshed our portfolio. In addition, we constantly review our entry requirements and have made some changes for the year ahead.

- **Computer Science** has reduced its standard grade requirements to A*A*A or equivalent. Although this is still a competitive requirement, it reflects our intention to expand the number of places available to talented and motivated students.
- **Medicine** and **Dentistry** now place more emphasis on the UCAT score and will prioritise high scorers when selecting applicants who will be invited to interview. At the same time, more 'aspirational' offers may be given to applicants with predicted grades that are slightly lower than the standard requirements (AAA or equivalent).

- **BSc Fashion Product Innovation** is the latest addition to our [Fashion subject area](#). These courses are business focused and do **not** involve any fashion design elements.
- **BA Global Social Challenges** is a newer course which brings together the combined strengths of subjects in our School of Social Sciences to explore a multi-disciplinary approach to addressing some of the world's greatest challenges.
- Student graduating with a standard National Curriculum Certificate of Completion are **not** eligible for direct entry.
