





Royal Society Funding for School Climate and Biodiversity Projects

Primary and secondary schools can apply to the Royal Society for grants of up to £3,000 to support projects addressing climate change and biodiversity issues.

Schools must have two project partners. The lead applicant should be the school; the second a STEM professional from academia or industry. The funding is to purchase necessary equipment. The next deadline is 30/11/24.
